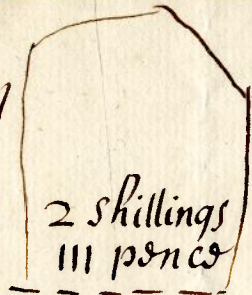

Memorandum this day and year above written
Clement Pretty a Customary Tenant of the said
Manour in open Court did surrender into the hands
of the Lord of the said Mann^e by the Hands of
Josua Blackwell Gent: Steward of the Court
holden for the said Mann^e. All that his Cottage
or Tenement and the little Close adjoining
to it situate standing lying and being in
Riddington aforesaid and now in the occupation
of Lyon Falkener & John Berridge together
with all Mounds Boards Fences Yards Gardens
Orchards Barnes Stables Outhouses Commons
Profits and appurtenances whatsoever to the
said Cottage or Tenement and close belonging
or Appurtenant to the Use and behoof of the
said Lyon Falkener and to his heirs and Assignes
for ever according to the Custom of the said
Manour.

my Copy by. This inclosed is a Copy
