Edward ALLEN (ALLIN), gentleman of Liddington

Will proved 1682

1 In the Name of God Amen
2 I Edward Allin of Liddington in the Countie Of Rutland Gentleman being
3 sick of body but of sound and perfect memory blessed bee God doe make this
4 my last Will and Testament In manner and forme following First
5 and above all I give and bequeath my Soule to Almighty God my
6 maker trusting through the meritorious death and passion of our Saviour
7 Jesus Christ to have free pardon for my sinne and my soule to bee saved
8 And my body to the Earth from whence it came in decent manner to
9 bee buried And for my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bestow
10 on mee I give and bequeath as hereafter mentioneth Imprimis I
11 give and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Allin the Cottage
12 house and homestead with all Apperten[^a]nces lately purchased of Thomas
13 Sherhod and Tenn pounds a yeare dureing her naturall life after my
14 decease keepinge herselfe widdow liveing with my Children and Feoffee
15 in trust for them till they accomplish the Age of One and Twenty yeares
16 or as long as shee pleaseth and can agree to live with them, In case shee
17 doe marry againe then shee to have Forty shillings a yeare out of the said
18 house and to get cleare from it, and soe to have it paid yearly by my Executor
19 dureing her naturall life and also Tenn pounds in mony, Item I give to my
20 daughter Elisabeth Allin Five hundred pounds whereof Three hundred to bee
21 paid to her at the age of Fifteene yeares and Two hundred to bee paid to her
22 when my sonn William Allin doth accomplish the age of One and Twenty
23 yeares Item I give to my aforesaid wife Elizabeth Allin All my household
24 goods to bee at her disposeing Item I give to my Sonne William Allin the
25 house and homestead now in the possession of Robert Collin and Three
26 halfe yard lands to the same belonging with all appertenances thereunto
27 that is to say Two of the said Three now in the possession of the said Robert
28 Collin and th'other in the possession of Laurence Reynolds to my said sonne
29 William and his heires Item I give to my said Sonn William Allin and to his
30 heires the house and homestead purchased of John Sismey with orchards

31 and gardens and leyes on the backside and a halfe yard Land I purchased of
32 Robert Boyer now in the possession of Edward Mason and a halfe yard land
33 I bought of William Boyell now in the possession of th'aforesaid Robert
34 Collin with all appertenances thereunto belonging which I lay to the house
35 late Sismeys Also I give to my said Sonne William and his heires foure
36 Acres of land leys and meadow bee it more or lesse Freehold purchased by mee
37 of William Horne likewise layed to the house I bought of Sismey with all
38 Appertenances thereto Also I give to my said Sonne and his heires Two
39 Acres of arrable land and grasse ground being Freehold purchased of
40 Thomas Manton with all Appertenances lyeing in the middle field of
41 Liddington Item I give to my said sonn the reversion of a Lease lately
42 taken of my Lord of Exeter formerly belonging to the house late of Sismey
43 Item I give to my said sonne William and his heires the house and
44 homestead at Edythweston with all appertenances now in the possession
45 of William Ball And also a halfe yard land more I purchased of Thomas
46 Islip with all appertenances lyeing in the Fields of Edythweston afores[ai]d
47 now in the possession of William Hart being Freehold Item I give to
48 my said sonne William and his heires All my estate both house and
49 Land or leyes at Upingham with all Appurtenances the head house
50 and land now in the possession of Edward King and John Taylor
51 and another in the possession of John Hill Likewise I give to my said Sonn
52 and his heires the Cottage house and homestead with all Appertenances
53 lately purchased of Robert Tansley And also all the Land and grasse
54 ground I purchased of Giles Law lyeing and being within the Feildes
55 and Territories of Kings Cliffe My Will is that my daughter
56 Elisabeth shall be mainteyned kept and brought up at my sonne
57 William's Cost and charge till She Accomplish the Age of One
58 and Twenty years keepeing herselfe single and unmarried Item my
59 mind and will is that my uncle John Burchnall and Lawrence
60 Reynolds shall sett a price of a Quarterne land and part of a homestead
61 and part of a Close, the land in the possession of Lawrence Reynolds the
62 house in William Waterfields hand and part of the Close in Robert
63 Collins hands Item I give to my Sonn William a Silver Tankard
64 and a Silver bowl, and to my daughter a Silver Tapp and Eight Silver Spooones All
65 the rest of my estate Goods and Chattells rights and Creditts whatsoever herein not

66 menc[*i*]oned unbeckeathed and not given I give and bequeath to my said Sonn William
67 Allin whom I make my full and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testam[*en*]t
68 Revokeing and disallowing all other Wills heretofore formerly by mee made Witnes
69 my hand and Seale the day and yeare above written. The marke of Edward Allin
70 Testator Signed Sealed Read published and declared in the presence of Thomas
71 Browne Francis Watson The marke of Thomas Drake

Summary of Latin Probate clause

Granted to Elisabeth Allin 2nd January 1681 (1682) as guardian of William Allin in his minority.
