It was known of fine land and half and one shute of brabb land
 to be of the estate, and one half and one shute of meadow lying
 in the territory of Liddington in the County of Rutland, which
 Robert Ireland of the same County gave and surrendered to the
 King's Majesty of England King James the first and his heirs as follows
 & dated the two and twentieth day of May Anno Domini 1639

- 1. In the Copper field; fine land at Welton lane end, Mr Mums on both sides
 road, from two land on the east, abutting Symon Ridgely's Rutland road
 road, Clement H. Rilles going one the North
- 2. In one land abutting the Alder's tree in the Park Wall, Robert Manton
 on the East side, Lion Halkner Court: on the West
- 3. In the middle field, one road of grass ground at the little block corner
 Symon road on the South
- 4. In one land at the Copper end of the town's furlong, the little from the way,
 Mr Lion Halkner on the South
- 5. In one land abutting Mr Ludd's Rutland Northward, & William Lorne's
 Rutland Southward, William Lorne on the West
- 6. In one land abutting the High way near Dunston Lodge, Mr Lion
 Halkner on the West side
- 7. In one Rutland at Morewell abutting Calder's field Southward, Mr
 Lion Halkner going on the West side
- 8. In one land at Gosmore, Mr Lion Halkner on the South side, and
 William Lorne on the West
- 9. In one Top at Saltmoore, Mr Lion Halkner on the East
- 10. In the North or field, one land in Mr Howland's edge, Mr Lion Halkner
 on the East
- 11. In one land in the Borden's edge (sometimes called Luff's edge) abutting the
 Rutland of John the Northward, & the Rutland of Thomas Temple Southward
 Mr Lion Halkner on the East
- 12. In one land upon the salt-pit, Mr Lion Halkner on the South
- 13. In one road of grass ground in the March, near the Meadow way
 usually lying to the Gosmore
- 14. In one half acre of meadow in the great meadow, abutting Mr Ludd's
 fine road Eastward; John Allen going on the West
- 15. In one shute of meadow at the Beacon end of the Dyke, Mr Lion
 Halkner on the East
