The said Jm^o of homage being Jurcellled and sworn by on the holy Bible they finde and affirm as followeth That
of Thomas Marston the said Henry Marston Nicholas for same John Wallker widow wuderfeld John Dring Thomas Freeman
Joseph Waterfield John Fryer Robert Day last John Manton John Waterfield and Richard Stungor have all of them neglected
their duty to the said Court and that William Fryer hath kept open the common highway not right of common there
and that William Waterfield Thomas Cantle Robert Woodward Michael Smith George Cooper John Freeman and
Rendelme Hill have made certain encroachments and that John Wood Edward Waterfield the elder William Wood
his mother Robert Wood and John Wood have taken in many encroachments and that Hugh Bammer and Edward Waterfield
have neglected their duty being sworn and that John Wallker son gent^l hath encroached the common way
of forty shoppes and that Edward Marston Thomas Cantle and John Wood have also encroached the common
of forty shoppes and that William Woodward Clement Woodward John Woodward Henry Clarke George Brown John
Shotton John Wallker Sheppard John Canfloy William Wright and Anthony Woodward have trespassed in
of shoppes in the wheats field of Upper Wyndesore therefore they are all of them amerced to the lord the honorable Jm^o
for upon their heads by

And after this Court it is founde by the homage that Anthony Minter this present day did surrender into the hands of the lord
by the hands of Thomas Smyth one of the donors of the manor of Dene messuage or tenement and one yard land thereto
belonging in the manor of Liddington aforesaid to the use and behoofe of him the said Anthony Minter for ever and
the termes of his naturall life and from and after his decease to the use and behoofe of Anthony Minter the younger one of
the sonnes of the said Anthony the elder and of his heires and assigns for ever according to the Customes whome the lord
hath thereof by his steward granted herein to have and to hold the said messuage yard land & premises of the aforesaid
to the said Anthony Minter the elder for ever among the termes of his naturall life and after his decease to the said Anthony
Minter the younger of his heires & assigns for ever at the will of the lord according to the Customes of the manor rendering there
for yearly to the lord of rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due and accustomed and they give to the lord assent
for these admittances as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after this Court John Hill and Margarett his wife the said Margarett being solely & secretly examined by the steward did
surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward one cottage of the aforesaid manor of Liddington aforesaid
to the use of Robert Canfloy and Wendone his wife and to the heires and assigns of the said Robert for ever to whom
the lord by his steward hath thereof granted herein to have and to hold the said cottage & premises unto the said Robert
of Canfloy and Wendone and to the heires & assigns of the said Robert for ever at the will of the lord according to the Customes of the
manor rendering therefore yearly to the lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due & accustomed
they give to the lord for assent as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after all this Court the said Robert Canfloy and Wendone his wife (she being solely examined by the steward) did
surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward the said cottage of the aforesaid manor to the use and
behoofe of William Horne and of his heires and assigns for ever to whom the lord hath thereof granted herein to have
and to hold the same to the said William Horne and his heires and assigns for ever at the will of the lord according to the
Customes of the manor rendering therefore yearly to the lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due & accustomed
they give to the lord assent for these admittances as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after this Court John Hill & Margarett his wife the said Margarett being solely examined by the steward did
surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward certain parcels of land meadow & pasture with the aforesaid manor
in Liddington aforesaid containing by estimation seven woods the same more or less to the use & behoofe of Simon Ward
and of his heires & assigns for ever to whom the lord hath thereof granted herein to have and to hold the same unto the said
Simon Ward and his heires and assigns for ever at the will of the lord according to the Customes of the manor rendering
therefore yearly to the lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due and accustomed they give to the lord
assent for these admittances as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after this Court Thomas Wallker and Garteroy his wife the said Garteroy being solely examined by the steward did
surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward one cottage with the aforesaid manor in Liddington now called
in the occupation of George Horne and Mary Wallker to the use & behoofe of Henry Sharpe & of his heires & assigns for ever
to whom the lord by his steward hath thereof granted herein to have and to hold the same to the said Henry Sharpe and his
heires & assigns for ever at the will of the lord according to the Customes of the manor rendering therefore yearly to the
lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due and accustomed they give to the lord assent for these
admittances as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after this Court Edward Waterfield hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Minter one of the donors
of the manor of Dene messuage or tenement and one cottage of the aforesaid manor of Liddington to the use & behoofe of him the said Edward for ever and among the
termes of his naturall life and after his decease to the use & behoofe of Edward Waterfield his sonne and Elizabeth his
wife and to the heires & assigns of the said Edward Waterfield the same for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath thereof
granted herein to have and to hold the same to the use & behoofe of the said Edward Waterfield at the will of the lord according to the Customes of the manor
rendering therefore to the lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services therefore due and accustomed they give to the lord assent
for these admittances as appears in the marginne here made healthie and are admitted tenants

And after this Court James Minter & Mary his wife the said Mary being solely examined by the steward did surrender into the
hands of the lord by the hands of his steward one cottage with the aforesaid manor in Liddington aforesaid & certain messuages
called shoppes land & two acres of arable land lying in the fields of Liddington aforesaid & occupied by the said cottage to
the use & behoofe of Charles Bammer & of his heires & assigns for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath thereof granted
and assigned herein to have and to hold the same to the said Charles Bammer & his heires & assigns for ever at the will of the lord
according to the Customes of the manor rendering therefore yearly to the lord yearly of 6^d rent shillings of 6^d and all other services
therefore due and accustomed they give to the lord assent for these admittances as appears in the marginne here made
healthie and are admitted tenants

And at this Court Charles Bonner did Surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of the Steward two acres of land lying in the fields of Liddington late James Minter's Do the use & behoofe of the said James Minter and Mary his wife and to the heirs and assigns of the said James for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George to have & to hold the said two acres of land wth the appurtenances unto the said James Minter & Mary and to the heirs & assigns of the said James for ever all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering therefore yearly to the lord 20s Kent & into of Court and other Services therefore due and accustomed They give the lord a fine upon their admittance as appears in the Margine here made Healtie and are admitted tenants

And at this Court Robert Groland did Surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of the Steward one messuage in the fields of Liddington Do the use & behoofe of him the said Robert for ever during the term of his natural life & after his death Do the use & behoofe of Robert Groland his Sonne and Elm his wife and the heirs & assigns of their two Bodies living and for default of such issue Do the use and behoofe of the heirs and assigns of the said Robert the Sonne for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George to have and to hold the same to the use aforesaid at the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering therefore yearly to the lord 20s Kent & into of Court and other Services therefore due and accustomed They give the lord a fine for their admittance as appears in the Margine here made Healtie and are admitted tenants

And that Charles Bonner hath Surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Minter one of the Donemars of this Mannor and messuage or tenement wth the appurtenances in Liddington now or late in the occupation of William Grey one of his assigns Do the use and behoofe of William Bonner and Mary his wife and the heirs of the body of the said William in the Body of the said Mary living and for default of such issue to the use of the heirs and assigns of the said William for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George to have and to hold the messuage and premises aforesaid to the use aforesaid all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering therefore yearly to the lord 20s Kent & into of Court and other Services therefore due and accustomed They give the lord a fine of 10s here made Healtie & are admitted tenants

They being sworn upon the holy Scriptures say and present as followeth First that Thomas George is a common seller of ale and bread and that William Brown is a common baker and have broken the assize of ale and bread wthin the jurisdiction of this Court And that Henry Newbont hath made Thomas Glyn his tenant to a house in Caldecott & hath not given bonds to save the common harmes to goe from any charge the said Thomas shall bring upon the same according to an order of this Court And that the said Henry Newbont hath suffered his horses to goe in the fields after St Thomas contrary to the order of this Court And that Robert Woodroffe Richard Morris Junr Margaret Woodroffe have kept their lanes before St Mark contrary to order of this Court And that Richard Morris & Anthony Woodroffe have not made their Bantles at place made according to the order of this Court And that Thomas Glyn and Thomas Glyn have expressed the common right of pasture And that one George Skime was bound and taken wth wthin this Mannor the first day of November 1651 and was apprized at 20s And that upon the 17 day of November 1651 George an offrayd was impounded & apprized at three shillings The Godall p^{er}sons above presented are arrested the several names sett upon their hounds By Walter Newbont and Robert Glyn they being sworn assessors

And at this Court it was found & presented by the homage that Lawrence Russell upon the 8th day of February 1651 did Surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter Newbont the elder one of the Donemars of this Mannor one messuage situate in Caldecott and one halfe yard lunde & other things wth appurtenances thereto belonging And one East in Snelfon & one yard lunde & other appurtenances thereto belonging and three acres of land wth appurtenances lying in the fields of Caldecott aforesaid Do the use and behoofe of Walter Newbont gent and William Glyn and their assigns for and during the term of six yeares from the feast of the Annunciation of the blessed Virgin Mary next ensuing the date of this present Surrender And from and after the expiration of the said term of six yeares then to the use and behoofe of Thomas Russell Brother of the said Lawrence and of his heirs and assigns for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Walter Newbont & William Glyn for & their assigns for ever during the said term of six yeares and from thenceforth unto the said Thomas Russell and his heirs and assigns for ever all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering to the lord yearly the Rents & Services therefore due and accustomed They give the lord a fine for their admittance as appears in the Margine here made Healtie & are admitted tenants

And that Robert Woodroffe hath Surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter Newbont gent one of the Donemars of this Mannor three acres of arable land wth the appurtenances in Caldecott Do the use & behoofe of Robert Glyn and of his heirs & assigns for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George to have & to hold the same to the said Robert Glyn his heirs & assigns for ever all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering to the lord yearly the Rents & Services therefore due & accustomed They give the lord a fine for admittance here made Healtie & is admitted tenant

And Annis Potton an Infant dyed seized of a Cottage wth the appurtenances in Caldecott aforesaid holden by George of Caldecott all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor and that William Boswile & Edward Boswile are the next kinemen to the said Annis Potton by the mothers side And at this Court Edward Boswile say Thomas Hulker gent his Attorney in this behalf lawfully authorized did Grand admittance into the said Cottage & premises To whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted George by the said Thomas Hulker to hold the same to the said Edward Boswile his heirs & assigns for ever & all the will of the lord according to the Customs of this Mannor Rendering therefore to the lord yearly the Rents & Services & therefore due and accustomed They give the lord a fine for his admittance and his Healtie is respected unless or

And that George Edward Watson Esq & Edward Denny the third day of January 1651 did Surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter Newbont Junr one of the Donemars of this Mannor one messuage & several plots of land meadow & pasture wth their appurtenances in Caldecott aforesaid and one quarter of an acre of land wth appurtenances by estimation wth appurtenances & one wood bee the same more or less and was or late in the occupation of the said Edward Denny or of his assigns Surrendered or voluntarily wth the said Edward Denny

And all other the Regie hould & Customary land and Tenement what so ever of them the said Sir Edward Watson
and Edward Deryng in Cutocton aforsayd Do the gift and behoope of Robert Dorsett and of his heires and assignes
for ever to resume the land by his steward huth therof granted & given to have and to hold the said pmisses
wth thour & every of thour apurtenances unto the said Robert Dorsett his heires and assignes for ever at the will of
the lord according to the Custome of the Marches & Landring there fore to the lord yearly in the feast of Pentecost
8 deniers there fore due and accustomed hee gives the lord a pnyce for his admittance as appears in the Margins huth
made & admitted Consent And after at this pnt the said Robert Dorsett did Surrender into
the hand of the lord by the hand of the steward the said messuage lands & pmisses wth thour & every of thour
apurtenances unto the gift and behoope of Thomas Dorsett & of his heires and assignes for ever to whom the
lord by his steward huth therof granted & given to have & to hold the said pmisses wth thour & every of
thour apurtenances unto the said Thomas Dorsett his heires & assignes for ever at the will of the lord according
to the Custome of the Marches & Landring to the lord yearly in the feast of Pentecost & other deniers there fore due
and accustomed hee gives the lord a pnyce for his admittance as appears in the Margins huth made & admitted
