THE EXCEMPT OF LUDDINGTON

TO THE STEWARD THERE IS SWORLED AS FOLLOWS

At the court held and court Baron of the right hon^e John Earl of Chester Baron of Brimborgh thord held on the
28th day of April in the year of our Lord Christ according to the ancient use of England 1652 by
the steward there is sworled as followeth

The sayd Jno^e & his homage being impelled and sworne vpon the holy Bible they find and present as followeth That
tho^e Thomas Wm^e son^e Lyen Syng Buton Nicholas ferdane John Wallkn^e Willm^e wylde John Dwyng^e Thomas Fegman
John Watesold John Ayre Robert Daynes John Burton John Watesold and Edward Stunton haue all of them negetted
themselves to the lord And that Willm^e Ayre hath had lyes & chears upon the common haunge not right or common thord
And that Willm^e Ayre & Thomas Lant Robert Horwood Willm^e Benth^e Stephen Cottrell John Atchman^e and
Rondme Hill haue made & contyned encroachment therid that ethem cap^e Edward waterfret the elder William Quill^e &
his mother Roberte Pol^e and John Pol^e haue taken in Inmallye & Hertynors therid that Hugh Benne^e and Edward reuelle
haue negetted thenselves to the lord And that Lyen Wallkn^e son^e haue emperched the common w^e
Horty & hoode And that Edward Newbold Thomas Bent^e and John Wdg^e haue also emperched the common w^e
therid that William Pennington & Clement Chaycock John Fysmer Henry Clark George Brownell John
Strickland Lyen Wallkn^e Chappell John Langley William Wright and Anthony Thorneys haue trespassed w^e
of p^e in the w^e hause of Willm^e Ayre & Apperayl^e Therefore they are all of them amerced to the lord the summe of yers
set upon thenselves by

James Hill and
James Pickett they being sworne as afores^e

And at this court it is found by the homage that Anthony Mawitor the 28th day did surrendere into the hands of the lord
by the hands of Thomas Smyth one of the seruantes of the manor of Luddington his messinge or denonc^e and one yarde land thereto
belonging w^e theire exhortentes in Luddington aforesaid to the use and behoofe of him the said Anthony Mawiter for a termyn
the tyme of his naturall lyfe and from and after his decess to the use and behoofe of Anthony Mawiter the younger one of
the seruantes of the said Anthony the elder and of his heredes and assignes for ever according to the custome in hys
huth therid by his steward granted to him to haule the said messinge yarde land & mylles w^e the exhortente
to the sayd Anthony Mawiter th^e lord for e dñe among the tyme of his naturall lyfe and after his decess to the said Anthony
Mawiter the younger e of his heredes and assignes for ever att the will of the lord according to the custome of the manor renderinge therid

And yearly to the lord by tent smite of god and all other seruantes therfore due and accustomed And they giv^e to the lord affyn
for thenselves admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denonts

And at this court John Hill and Margaret his wife the sayd Margaret being solely & rettely examined by the steward did
surrendere into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward Bro^e Pottage w^e the exhortentes in Luddington aforesaid
to the use of Robert Cansley and Prudent^e his wife and to the heires and assignes of the said Robert for ever to hys
the lord by his steward huth therid granted to him to haule the said cottage & mylles unto the said Robert
Cansley and Prudent^e and to the heires & assytes of the said Robert for ever att the will of the lord according to the custome of this
manor renderinge therfore to the lord yearly by tent smite of tent smite of tent and other seruantes therfore due and accustomed
they giv^e to the lord for a ffyne as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denonts

And after all this court the said Robert Cansley and Prudent^e his wife (as he being solely examined by the steward
did surrendere into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward the said cottage w^e the exhortente to the use and
behoofe of William Horne and of his heredes and assignes for ever to whom the lord huth therid granted to him to haule
the said cottage & mylles unto the said William Horne and his heredes and assignes for ever att the will of the lord according to the
custome of the manor renderinge therfore yearly to the lord by tent smite of tent smite of tent other seruantes therfore due and accustomed
he giv^e to the lord a ffyne for his admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denonts

And at this court John Hill & Margaret his wife the said Margaret being solely examined by the steward did surrendere
into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward to whom the said cottage w^e the exhortente in Luddington now or late
in the tyme of George I^e and Mary Bulmer to the use & behoofe of Henry Sharp e of his heredes assytes for ever
to whom the lord by his steward huth therid granted to him to haule the same to the said Henry Sharp and his
heredes and assignes for ever att the will of the lord according to the custome of the manor renderinge therfore yearly to the
lord by tent smite of tent smite of tent other seruantes therfore due and accustomed he giv^e to the lord a
ffyne for his admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denont

And that at this court Thomas Hallmer and Gartry his wife the sayd Gartry being solely examined by the steward did
surrendere into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward and Pottage w^e the exhortentes in Luddington now or late
in the tyme of George I^e and Mary Hallmer to the use & behoofe of Henry Sharp e of his heredes assytes for ever
to whom the lord by his steward huth therid granted to him to haule the same to the said Henry Sharp and his
heredes and assignes for ever att the will of the lord according to the custome of the manor renderinge therfore yearly to the
lord by tent smite of tent smite of tent other seruantes therfore due and accustomed he giv^e to the lord a
ffyne for his admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denont

And that Edward Waterfield hath sworne & sworled into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Mawitor one of the seruantes
of this manor aforesaid to the use & behoofe of the exhortentes in Luddington to the use & behoofe of him the said Edward for and during the
tyme of his naturall lyfe and after his decess to the use & behoofe of Edward Waterfield his sonne and Elizabeth his
wife and to the heires & assignes of the said Edward Waterfield the sonne for ever to whom the lord by his steward huth therid
granted to him to haule the same to the use & behoofe of him the said Edward Waterfield according to the custome of this manor
renderinge therfore to the lord yearly by tent smite of tent smite of tent other seruantes therfore due and accustomed they giv^e to the lord a
ffyne for thenselves admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made Roalthe and are admitted denont

And that at this court James Mawitor & Mary his wife the sayd Mary being solely examined by the steward did surrendere into the
hands of the lord by the hands of his steward one cottage w^e the exhortente in Luddington aforesaid to the use & behoofe
of the exhortente in Luddington aforesaid to the use & behoofe of him the said James Mawitor for and during the
tyme of his naturall lyfe and after his decess to the use & behoofe of Charles Bamur e of his heredes assignes for ever to whom the lord by his steward huth therid
granted to him to haule the same to the said Charles Bamur & his heredes assignes for ever att the will of the lord
according to the custome of this manor renderinge therfore yearly to the lord by tent smite of tent smite of tent other seruantes
therfore due and accustomed he giv^e to the lord a ffyne for his admyttance as apoured in the margin haue made
Roalthe and are admitted denont

And at this Court Charles Bonner did surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of the steward one acre of land lying in the field of Liddington to James Minton to the use & behoofe of the said James Minton and Mary his wife and to the heirs and assigns of the said James for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath thereto granted & given to have & to hold the said two acres of land by the aforesaid onto the said James & Mary and to the heirs & assigns of them & to the said James for ever at the will of the lord according to the custome of this maner & rendering therefor yearly to the lord by Rent & into court and other summes therfore due and accustomed they give the lord a synd upon their admittance in the margin hand made sealde and are admitted tenents.

And at this Court Robert Frolund did surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of the steward one messuage in Liddington appointed in Liddington to the use & behoofe of him the said Robert for wrong the tairme of his naturall life & to his heires to the use & behoofe of Robert Frolund his sonne and Ann his wife and the heirs & assigns of them two boordes ylling and for default of such ylling to the use and behoofe of the heirs and assigns of the said Robert the same for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath thereto granted & given to have and to helde the same to the use aforesaid at the will of the lord according to the custome of this maner & rendering thereof yearly to the lord by Rent & into court and other summes therfore due and accustomed they give the lord a synd for their admittance as aforesaid in the margin hand made sealde and are admitted tenents

And that Charles Remond hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Painter one of the donees made of
the Manno⁹ and messuage or tenement of the aforesaid in Redington now or late in the execution of William Foxe or his assignee
on the 21st and belvest of William Bonner and Mary his wife and they having of the body of the said William in the body of
the said Mary yf hys and her deauall of hys yf hys to the vye of the horred and assygned of the said William for ever forehend
the lord by his Standard hath therfore granted & given to hold the messuage and xmisses aforesaid to the vyd aforesaid
at the will of the lord according to the custome of the Manno⁹ renderynge yearly to the lord xij^o leuett dñe of bothe other demittis
þerefor dñe and attorneymde þey gant the lord a kyng of þand made Adelie⁹ and admitted tenente

They being bound upon the hly Ry^l by Ayn and p^{nt} as followeth first that Thomas George is a man felon of al and bound clud that william Brewnd is a Common Baker and haue broken the assy^d of ale and bread w^m the jurisdiction of this bo^t. And that homy Newbont hath made Thomas Glyd his Servt to a horse in Valdecoff & ha^t not given Bente to pane the doone horse from my charge the sayd Thomas shall bringe uppon the same according to an order of this bo^t. And that the said homy Newbont ha^t sp^zed his berte to god in the field after St Thomas Contrary to the order of this bo^t. And that Robert Woodville Richard Morris & Margarett Woodville haue kept there leves before St Mark contrary to order of bo^t. And that Richard Morris & Anthony Colfayne haue not made their Ranteys at place Marke according to the order of the bo^t. And that Richard Morris & Anthony Colfayne haue expressed the Common r^g of bo^t. And that the shewe glint was levell and taken w^m off this memo^r the 11th day of November 1651 and was apprized att 2^o M^h that upon the 12th day of November 1651 one pigge an estray new impounded & apprized att three & halflings; The gendall p^{nt}s above p^{nt}ed are amstred the stand^g Comed betwⁿ upon theire bounds by Walter Newbont & Robert Glyd they being bound as aforesd.

And at this court was now founde exponed by the humage & but Lawrence Russell upon the 9 moneth day of February 1651 did x
Sworendon into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter Newbent the elder one of the gentemen of this maner on messayge
Inhalde in Caldecott and one halfe year lande & other thysmantes theron to belonging And one rof in Snelfor a one
yerd lande & other unsmantes theron to belonging and three acres and fourt of arable lande by the countey lying in the
Hilles of Caldecott aforesayed to the vsd and behalfe of Walter Newbont gentl and Willian Sly and therre assygned for and
durynge the tyme of sixt yeaors from the feaste of the clannuntion of the blessed Virgin Mary next ensuinge the date of
this present Sworendon And from and after the expiracion of the said tyme of sixt yeaors then to the vsd and behalfe of Thomas
Russell Brother of the said Lawrence and of his heires and assygnes for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath therof
granted hym to haue and to hold the said yemedes into the said Walter Newbont & Willian Sly for & therre assygnes for e
ffyd p^t 7^s during the said tyme of sixt yeaors and from thenceforth unto the said Thomas Russell and his heires and assygnes for ever
all the rente of the lord according to the custome of this maner rendryng to the lord yearly the perte and dornice therfore
and answere thereto they gwe the lord a pente for therre admittance as appeareth in the mayme hand made sealthe card
admitted & sone

And that Robert Woodroffe hathe surrounded into the service of the lord by the hands of Walter Newbene gent one of the gentmen of

of the lord according to the custome of that maner and that Willm Rosvile & Edward Rosvile are the next beneficaries to the said
Rannius Pottyn by the mothers side & stand at this Court Edward Rosvile by Thomas Shulles gent his attorney in this behalf
lawfully authorized did present admittance unto the said cottage & messuage to whom the lord by his steward half yearly
granted seizm by the said Thomas Shulles to hold the same to the said Edward Rosvile his heirs & assigns for ever &
at the will of the lord according to the custome of the maner rendering therfore to the lord yearly the rents & garners of
therfore and as accustomed has given the lord a bynd for his admittance and his realle is esquierred in full et

And all other the bothe holdes & custome under and deuony what feuer of them the said kyng Edward Watson
and Edward dorres in Gudfodott aforseyd to the yre and behalfe of Robert Dovestt and of his sonnes and assynd
for ever to sygne his lord by his stonard hech chyckly graunted to hym to haue and to hould the said pmisses
of thys country of thys apertente unto the said Robert Dovestt his sonnes and assynd for ever att the will of
the lord accordyng to the custome of the Marmo londynge theroford to the lord nowayl m^o viijth Febrill 8m of Roialme of Edward
8m yeres theroford due and accustomed hec godes the lord a synd for his admittance as aperde in the Marmo hech
