

The manor of Liddington <sup>Baron of Bunting</sup> At the Court of the right Honoble John Earle of Exeter there was held the power of exchequer  
with Garsdon <sup>1652.</sup> Day of April in the year of our Lord Christ according to the account now set in my lands.  
By the Standard thereto is enrolled as followeth: At this Court Robert Ireland did surrender into the hands of the said  
Lord by the hands of the Standard one messuage with appurtenances in Liddington to the use & behoofe of him the said  
Robert for during the course of his natural life & after his death to the use & behoofe of Robert Ireland his Sonnes &  
under his roote & the issue & assigns of them & his body & his next for default of payment to the use & behoofe of the  
said assignee of the said Robert Ireland to come for ever to whom the Lord by his Standard hath given or granted  
to have & to hold the same to the said aforesaid at the will of the Lord according to the customs of the manor & during  
the same. Hereby it is yearly to the Lord if Rent Geuer of Court & other & other herofore due & accustomed. They quit their  
Lord & goods for their admittance as appears in the margin & have made readye & are admitted & want
