**They** present and saye as followeth first that James Dixit hath dyed a man having a ffeoffe in the field after  
the said was by will made by the said of one hundreth contrary to the order of this Court And that on Autmyn 1619  
Thomas Smyth Jr and William Ward have left divers in the heire of Coves contrary to the order of this Court And that  
And that William Ward hath surcharged the field of one hundreth and eighteene shires And that Robert Sherwood  
Matherell with Stephen Collier and Endine Hill John Strode and Thomas Lavelle have made intratiments  
And that William Newbold gentle and Robert Manton have written hentes to attorneyes and have witten bond to see  
the dower according to the order of this Court And that Richard Ward hath taken in an Inmut And that  
William Ward hath made a yownde brach And that Thomas Sherwood hath vnde a maner desygnt to one  
Cult in a plote calleth Breckness And that Robert Collier William Hownd Matherell Jr. old John Thorpe Robert  
Hewson John Dleton and Endine Wright have surcharged the Comone of their soe And that Lureson Browne and  
William Hownd have surcharged the field of Chepe And that Thomas Burton in Byrdy gentl Esqry  
Johnsen gentl of Richard Esqrl and John Dleton are entred to this Court and consent to the lord of this maner and have  
negatived to god thare suide Comone to this Court And for the said sondre pson and amstred of the same  
the generall shires or somes of mony 1000 imposed upon thair heads  
And at this Court it was stemed by the homage that mrsd Allen the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1653 did remondon into  
the hands of the lord of this maner by the hands of James Dixit one of the tenementes of this maner All the  
severall plotes of land meadens and pasturis lyinge being in the said place psonnes and places of Liddington  
aforesaid accounted one hundreth land wth there and eareys of there accounted wth said psonnes the said mrsd  
Allen late ly had & purchased of Matherell Allen to the use of Matherell Annes widow and of her heires and assy  
son enys according to the custome of the maner Upon Condon notwithstanding that yf the said Mrsd Allen  
departed of the last will and testament of Endine Stanger deceased his hentes deputed on administratioun some or  
one of them shall well & truly satisfie and paye or cause to bee well & truly satisfie and paye unto the said Bridgett Russell  
her trespouyd attorneye psonnes on administratioun the summe of þ 1000000 of good & lawfull mony of England  
wardly and eareyward for and during the termes of two years commeng the Twelveth day of January last  
past and ending the Twelveth day of Janury 1654 yf the said Bridgett Russell happen to liue so longe at me tyme  
Twelveth day of Janury And att or in the new dwelling house of Matherell Reynolds situated in  
Liddington aforesaid the first paym<sup>t</sup> therwyl to bee made beginning the first day of Janury 1653 And also yf  
the said mrsd Allen his heires deputed on administratioun some or one of them shall well & truly satisfie and paye  
or cause to bee well & truly satisfie and paye unto the said Bridgett Russell her trespouyd attorneye psonnes summe  
satten the exipation of the said two yeres the summe of þ 1000000 of good & lawfull mony of England wardly  
and eareyward syngid among the barons of the maner by þ 1000000 of the said Bridgett Russell att me on the Twelveth  
day of Janury att or in the new dwelling house of the said Matherell Reynolds situated in Liddington aforesaid according to  
the true intent & meaning of the said will the first paym<sup>t</sup> therwyl shall happen to liue so longe to bee made and  
beginning att or in the Twelveth day of Janury next shalbes in the year 1655 Then the aboue written remondon  
to bee paid or else stand & remaine in full force estanding  
And that Endine Waterfield snt the last Court did remondon into the hands of the lord of the maner by the hands of  
Thomas Smyth one of the tenementes of the maner aforesaid One cottage wth the appertinetes in Liddington aforesaid  
in the occupation of Mary Waterfield and Endine Waterfield to the use of John Waterfield his heire and assynd for  
ever to whom the lord by his steward hath therwyl graunted þ 2000000 to haue to haule the said cottage & psonnes  
onto the said John Waterfield his heires and assynd for ever at the will of the lord according to the custome of  
the maner aforesaid vnderwriting to the lord yearly þ 600 rent suide of lode and other summes thereto. And as accustomed they gave the lord  
a sume for their admittance to haule the same haue more sume psonnes admitted thereto.  
And that Charles Remond snt the last Court hath remondoned into the hands of the lord by the hands of James  
Dixit one of the tenementes of the maner aforesaid All his estate right leyle & reversion of him into one cottage  
þ 1000000 of the appertinetes in a plote calleth Biggs Land in Liddington aforesaid then in the possession of the said Charles  
and assynd of John Freeman to the use and behooffe of John Lant his heire & assynd to whom the lord  
by his steward hath therwyl graunted þ 2000000 to haule to haule the said cottage of the appertinetes onto the said John  
Lant his heire & assynd for ever at the will of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid vnderwriting to

them and every of them apertenes to him & coming in Thorpe and Liddington aforesaid (less the lands of  
domen<sup>t</sup> of John Tissay gent) To the vsse & behoofe of Samuell Taylor thake and him his wif and two  
sonnes of them two brother lawfully begotten and for want of futhysse to the vsse of the right heres of the said  
Samuell for ever to whom the lord by his steward with the said grant of 80z in the hand and to hould the  
said messege Cottage lands and messeges unto the said Samuell Taylor and him and the sonnes of them Rodes  
carefully begotten and for want of futhysse to the vsse of the right heres of the said Samuell for ever  
at the rate of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid renderinge to the lord yearly Rent suite of Court  
all other seruices therfore due and accustomed they gaue the lord a synde to hould the summe or haue made Afullid  
and are admitted tenentes

William Bringhurst Richard Morris John Alin Sly Robert Woodroffe John Woodroffe Walter Buntinge Chetham  
Godsharpe and William Chapman being all duly sworn upon the holy Byble they present as followeth vist

First the present and sayd that Thomas George is a leman bryer and hath broken the affreight in selling his ale aboard  
And that Richard Morris son Robert Woodroffe William Bringhurst have tyed tressis no 1 & upon other mens gromet  
contrary to the order of this Court And that Sir Enslabell poyle hath overcharged the stedes of Caldecott by cost  
And that the said Sir Enslabell hath bin a leman to expens his cheape in the stede of Caldecott aforesaid And that  
Henry reverent hath stopped & turned a comyn highwaye yarde to a place called windmill leade in Caldecott aforesaid to  
the leman appoynted And that John Russell Richard Hill Anthony Godsharpe William George & John Bringhurst John  
Woodroffe son and Thomas Richard son<sup>hys</sup> have swicharged in the stede of Caldecott with horses Therfore all the said  
swicharged persons are byt not and amerced to the lord of the maner the swerde shynnes or somer of money imposed & sett  
upon thone heads

And at this Court it was found by the homage that John Hill hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands  
of Walter Ribone the elder one of the denevours of the maner aforesaid One messege & one third pte of a yarde land  
of the apertenes in Caldecott aforesaid to the vsse of his now wife of the said John Hill long dyring the tyme of her  
naturrel lyfe To whome the lord by his steward hath therfore granted 80z in the hand & to hould the said messege  
and third pte of a yarde land of the apertenes unto the said John long dyring the tyme of her naturrel lyfe at the  
rate of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid renderinge to the lord yearly m<sup>b</sup>-m<sup>d</sup> Rent suite of  
Court and all other seruices therfore due & accustomed byt gives the lord a synde for her admittance to hould the summe  
hath made Afullid and are admitted tenentes

And that Edward Roseville gent & into the last Court hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter  
Reverb gent & one of the denevours of the maner aforesaid All that Cottage or tenement with the apertenes in  
Caldecott aforesaid now or late in the occupancy of Walter Buntinge or his assygnes to the vsse & behoofe of Henry  
Dylinsted his heires and assygnes for ever to the said Henry the lord by his steward hath by Thomas Eastleynne  
the attorney of the said Henry in this behalfe granted 80z in the hand & to hould the said Cottage w<sup>t</sup> the apertenes  
onto the said Henry Dylinsted his heires and assygnes for ever at the rate of the lord according to the custome of the  
maner aforesaid renderinge to the lord yearly Rent suite of Court other seruices therfore due & accustomed  
he gaue the lord a synde for his admittance to hould the summe he hath made Afullid and are admitted tenentes

And that Thomas Russell and Susanna his wife the said Susanna being swichly examined by the stewardes have surrendered  
into the hands of the lord by the hands of his steward One messege & one halfe yard lande w<sup>t</sup> the apertenes to the vsse & behoofe in  
Caldecott aforesaid to the vsse following That is to saye At to and concerning the said messege and messeges  
of the said halfe yard lande to the vsse & behoofe of John Russell son of the said Thomas Russell and Ruthern  
his wife for ever dyring the tyme of their naturrel lyfe and the lyfe of the longer lufe of them And after thare  
deceased to the vsse of the heires and assygnes of the said John Russell And at to and concerning the other messeges of  
the said halfe yard lande w<sup>t</sup> the vsse of his heires before remitted to the vsse & behoofe of the said John Russell his  
heires and assygnes for ever subject to the condicione hereunderwritten To whom the lord by his steward hath cost of  
granted 80z in the hand & to hould the said messege & halfe yard lande w<sup>t</sup> the apertenes to the vsse & behoofe  
& entitelt to the condicione herein after expressed at the rate of the lord according to the custome of the maner  
aforesaid renderinge to the lord Rent suite of Court all other seruices therfore due & accustomed  
they gaue the lord a synde for their admittance to hould the summe he hath made Afullid and are admitted tenentes  
Upon this condicione notwithstanding That is to saye the said John Russell his heires & assygnes or administratores shall not well  
and truly paye or cause to bee payd unto the said Thomas Russell & Susanna his wife dyring their lufe lande all  
the heire of the emmynacme of the blessed virgin & mary of 8<sup>t</sup> mychale the arthangelle by eynall portions the yearly  
summe of eight pounds and after the decess of the said Thomas Russell shall him garnisched That is to saye  
the said John his heires & assygnes or administratores shall not well and truly paye or cause to bee payd unto the said  
Susanna at the next daye after said the yeres of some of thynge yownde yewell money of england and chyd of the said  
John Russell his heires & assygnes or administratores shall not well and truly paye or cause to bee payd unto the said Thomas  
Russell and Susanna or the heire of them at the next daye of 8<sup>t</sup> mychale the arthangelle w<sup>t</sup> shalbed in the yarde of our lord  
Christ 1653 the sume of twenty pounds of like yewell money of England Then this swende shalbed voide &
