At the point ofARRANT plogge and Comt Baron of the right hono^{ble} John Earle of Exeter Baron of Burghley
there shewen the fine and Twentieth Day of October in the year of our lord Christ according to the awmp^{ts} made
in Eng land one thousand six hundred fiftie and three by the Steward there it is rolled as followeth (viz)

Thomas Cant, William Hone, John Webster, Symon Ward, and James Hill they being all sworn upon the holy sc^{pt} b^{ld}

They

present and say as followeth first that James Dixtall hath dyed a mare having a foale in the stable after
the mare was six weeks old by the space of one weeks contrary to the order of this Court And that by on Aultnech
Thomas Smyth Jun and William Ward have kept steeres in the herd of Cowes contrary to the order of this Court
And that William Jun hath surcharged the stables wth one horse and eighteene sheeps And that Robert Sherrwood
Michael Burt, Stephen Colter, and Kendome Hill John Freeman and Thomas Lant have made surrentments
And that William Norborne gent and Robert Manton have taken hedges to be removed and have not given bond to fore
the Court according to the order of this Court And that Richard Ward hath taken in an Inmate And that
William Hone Jun hath made a ground breach And that Francis Sherrwood hath been a common trespasser wth one
Cull in a place called Westmoles And that Robert Colwell, William Hone, Michael Reynold, John Thorpe, Robert
Howler, John Dutton and Kendome Hill have surcharged the commons wth sheeps And that Lawrence Brown and
William Fox have surcharged the stables wth sheeps And that Thomas Burton Esq^r m^r Byrd gent, Egghill
John gent, Richard Bigg, and John Dutton are sutes to this Court and consent to the lord wth this maner and have
noted to doe there sutes wth this Court Therefore the said severall persons and amercied wth the
the severall fines or some of money wth imposed upon their heads

And

at this Court it was awarded by the homage that Moses Allen the first day of June 1653 did Surrender into
the hands of the lord of this maner by the hands of James Dixtall one of the donowars of this maner All the
severall p^{ar}ts of land meadows and pastures lying & being in the stables wth the p^{ar}ts and places of Liddington
aforesaid amounting one hundred and thirty one acres and one rood and one penny of an acre wth the said Moses
Allen lately had purchased of Mather Allen Do the use of Bridgett Kustell widow and of her heires and affs
for ever according to the custome of the maner Upon Condition notwithstanding that wth the said Moses Allen
Kendome Hill last will and testament of Edward Stanger deceased his heires executors or administrators or some or
one of them shall well & truly satisfy and pay or cause to be well & truly satisfied and paid unto the said Bridgett Kustell
her executor or administrators or administrators the some of seven hundred of good lawful money of England
yearly and every year for and during the term of two years commencing the Twelveth day of January last
past and ending the Twelveth day of January 1654 wth the said Bridgett Kustell happen to live so longe all wth upon the
Twelveth day of January And all or in the new dwelling house of Michael Reynold situated & being in
Liddington aforesaid the first paym^{ts} thereof to be made & begun the first day of January 1653 And also wth
the said Moses Allen his heires executors or administrators or some or one of them shall well & truly satisfy & pay
or cause to be well & truly satisfied and paid unto the said Bridgett Kustell her executor or administrators
after the expiration of the said two years the some of twenty pounds of good and lawful money of England yearly
and every year for & during the term of the natural life of the said Bridgett Kustell all wth upon the Twelveth
day of January or all or in the new dwelling house of the said Michael Reynold situated in Liddington aforesaid according to
the true intent & meaning of the said will the first paym^{ts} thereof wth shee happen to live so longe to be made and
begin all wth and upon the Twelveth day of January wth shall be in the year 1655 Then the above written Surrender
to be void or of no stand & remaine in full force & stand

And

that Kendome Hill surrendered into the hands of the lord of the maner by the hands of
Thomas Smyth one of the donowars of the maner aforesaid one cottage wth the apartments in Liddington aforesaid
the occupation of Mary Waterfoild and Kendome Hill waterfoild Do the use of John Waterfoild his heire and assigns for
ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath there wth granted & given to have & to hold the said cottage & p^{ar}ts
unto the said John Waterfoild his heires and assigns for ever all the wth of the lord according to the custome of
the maner aforesaid according to the lord yearly of rent sutes of Court & all other services therefor due & accustomed
hee gave the lord a fine for his admittance to have & to hold the same hath made fealty & is admitted tenant

And

that Thomas Norborne gent surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James
Dixtall one of the donowars of the maner aforesaid one cottage wth the apartments in Liddington aforesaid then or
late in the occupation of George Howle Do the use & behoofe of John Johnson and Elm his wife and the heires and
assigns of the said John Johnson for ever To whom the lord by his Steward hath there wth granted & given to have &
to hold the said cottage wth the apartments unto the said John Johnson and Elm and the heires and assigns of
the said John Johnson for ever all the wth of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid according to the
lord yearly of rent sutes of Court and all other services therefor due and accustomed they gave the lord
a fine for their admittance to have & to hold the same hath made fealty & is admitted tenant

And

that Charles Bomer surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James
Dixtall one of the donowars of the maner aforesaid all his right & title of one cottage wth the apartments in Liddington aforesaid
of the apartments situated in a place called Higg Land in Liddington aforesaid then in the possession of the said Charles
or of his assigns of John Freeman Do the use & behoofe of John Lant his heires & assigns for ever To whom the lord
by his Steward hath there wth granted & given to have & to hold the said cottage wth the apartments unto the said John
Lant his heires & assigns for ever all the wth of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid according to the
lord yearly of rent sutes of Court and all other services therefor due & accustomed hee gave the lord a fine for
his admittance to have & to hold the same hath made fealty & is admitted tenant

And

that Robert Cant surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Dixtall one of the
donowars of the maner aforesaid all his right & title of one cottage wth the apartments in Liddington aforesaid
called the Swam Do the use & behoofe of Margarett wrothwell sister of the said John Lant for & during the term
of her natural life and after her decease do the use & behoofe of Susanna wrothwell daughter of the said Margarett
and all & every other the children of the said Margarett begotten to be begotten and the heires of the said Margarett
And for default of such issue do the use & behoofe of Thomas Howle some of Robert Howle wth his heires & assigns for ever
Do the said Margarett the lord by his Steward hath granted & given to have & to hold the said cottage wth the apartments
unto the said Margarett all the wth of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid according to the
lord yearly of rent sutes of Court and all other services therefor due & accustomed they gave the lord a fine for
their admittance to have & to hold the same hath made fealty & is admitted tenant

And

that Margarett wrothwell surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Dixtall one of the
donowars of the maner aforesaid all her right & title of one cottage wth the apartments in Liddington aforesaid
called the Swam Do the use & behoofe of Margarett wrothwell sister of the said John Lant for & during the term
of her natural life and after her decease do the use & behoofe of Susanna wrothwell daughter of the said Margarett
and all & every other the children of the said Margarett begotten to be begotten and the heires of the said Margarett
And for default of such issue do the use & behoofe of Thomas Howle some of Robert Howle wth his heires & assigns for ever
Do the said Margarett the lord by his Steward hath granted & given to have & to hold the said cottage wth the apartments
unto the said Margarett all the wth of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid according to the
lord yearly of rent sutes of Court and all other services therefor due & accustomed they gave the lord a fine for
their admittance to have & to hold the same hath made fealty & is admitted tenant

upon this condition that in the said Margarett wrothwell or any of
her children shall survive Susanna Howle wife of Robert Howle then the said Margarett or her children shall pay unto the
said Thomas Howle wth in one year after the decease of the said Susanna the some of ten pounds of lawful
money of England

And that Robert Elbert gentl the sixt day of July 1653 did Surrender into the hands of the Lord of the maner
 by the hands of his Steward All his estate and interest of me into one messuage and one halfe yard land
 into be longing unto and unto one cottage and one other halfe yard land & thereunto be longing
 there and enow of their appurtenances situate lying & being in Thorpe and Liddington aforesaid (into the lands of
 Denom of John Dymoy gentl) To the use & behoofe of Samuell Cayley clerke and Alm his wife and the
 heires of there two bodies lawfully begotten and for want of such issue to the use of the right heires of the sayd
 Samuell for ever To whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof graunted & given To have and to hold the
 said messuage Cottage lands and premises unto the said Samuell Cayley and Alm and the heires of there bodies
 lawfully begotten and for want of such issue to the use of the sayd heires of the said Samuell for ever all the will
 of the Lord according to the Custome of the maner aforesaid rendering to the Lord yearly Rent suite of Court &
 all other services therof due and accustomed They gave the Lord a fine to hold the same or have made Heald
 and are admitted Tenants

Walter Newbome gentl Peter Woodroffe Nathury Ward Robert Sly John Hill Samuell Hill Walter Newbome son
 William Brimhurst Richard Morris Jun Allen Sly Robert Woodroffe John Woodroffe Walter Brimbley Chitham
 Godshawe and William Chapman being all duly sworn upon the holy Byble they present as followeth

First the report and sayd that Thomas George is a common brewer and hath broken the assize in selling his ale & beer
 And that Richard Morris Jun Robert Woodroffe & William Brimhurst have tyed there houses upon other mens grounds
 contrary to the order of this Court And that Sr Eusebius presant hath overcharged the Heires of Caldecott wth costs
 And that the said Sr Eusebius hath bin a common trespasser his sheep in the Heires of Caldecott aforesaid And that
 Henry Newbome hath stopped & turned a torgn high waye toward a place called windmill lease in Caldecott aforesaid to
 the common appoynted And that John Russell Richard Hill Eltham Godshawe William George John Brimhurst John
 Woodroffe Jun and Thomas Richard son have surcharged in the Heires of Caldecott wth horses Therefore all the said
 lord ays and they and amerced to the Lord of the maner the severall fines or some of money imposed & sett
 upon there heads

And all this Court it was found by the homage that John Hill hath Surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands
 of Walter Newbome the older one of the Denemen of the maner aforesaid One messuage & one third pt of a yard land
 of the appurtenances in Caldecott aforesaid to the use of Jane New wife of the said John Hill for & during the term of her
 naturall life To whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof graunted & given To have and to hold the said messuage
 and third pt of a yard lands wth the appurtenances unto the said Jane for & during the term of her naturall life at the
 will of the Lord according to the Custome of the maner aforesaid rendering to the Lord yearly Rent suite of Court &
 all other services therof due & accustomed She gave the Lord a fine for her admittance to hold the same
 hath made Heald and is admitted Tenant

And that Edward Rosvill gentl since the last Court hath Surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands of Walter
 Newbome gentl one of the Denemen of the maner aforesaid All that Cottage or Tenement wth the appurtenances in
 Caldecott aforesaid now or late in the occupation of Walter Brimbley or of his assignes To the use & behoofe of Henry
 Dylivestle his heires and assignes for ever To wth said Henry the Lord by his Steward hath & by Thomas Custlerme
 the attorney of the said Henry in this behalfe) graunted & given To have and to hold the said Cottage wth the appurtenances
 unto the said Henry Dylivestle his heires and assignes for ever all the will of the Lord according to the Custome of the
 maner aforesaid rendering to the Lord yearly Rent suite of Court & other services therof due & accustomed
 she gave the Lord a fine for her admittance to hold the same hath made Heald & is admitted Tenant

And that Thomas Russell and Susanna his wife the sayd Susanna being solemne examined by the Steward) have Surrendered
 into the hands of the Lord by the hands of his Steward One messuage & one halfe yard land wth there appurtenances in
 Caldecott aforesaid To the use & behoofe of John Russell Baron & some of the said Thomas Russell and Ruthemid
 his wife for and during the term of there naturall lives and the life of the longer lives of them And after there
 decease to the use of the heires and assignes of the said John for ever Unto and concerning the other moztid of
 the said halfe yard land wherof nozd of is heron before is mitted To the use and behoofe of the said John Russell his
 heires and assignes for ever (subject to the Condition here under written) To whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof
 graunted & given To have and to hold the said messuage & halfe yard lands wth the appurtenances to the use aforesaid
 & subject to the condition here after expressed) all the will of the Lord according to the Custome of the maner
 aforesaid rendering to the Lord yearly Rent suite of Court & all other services therof due & accustomed
 they gave the Lord a fine for there admittance to hold the same hath made Heald and are admitted tenants
 Upon this Condition notwithstanding That if hee the sayd John Russell his heires or assigns or administrators shall not well
 and truly paye or cause to be payd unto the said Thomas Russell & Susanna his wife during there joynt lives all
 the wealth of the Communion of the blessed virgin & Mary & St Michael the archangel by equall portions the yearly
 some of eight poundes And after the decease of the said Thomas or the sayd Susanna shall him survive That if
 the said John his heires or assigns or administrators shall not well and truly paye or cause to be payd unto the said
 Susanna all the wealth of the sayd St Michael the archangel by equall portions the yearly some of eight poundes
 John Russell his heires or assigns or administrators shall not well and truly paye or cause to be payd unto the sayd Thomas
 Russell and Susanna or the Survivors of them all the wealth of St Michael the archangel wth shall be in the year of our Lord
 Christ 1658 the some of Twenty poundes of lawfull money of England Then this surrender shall be void &
