First that Hugh Wemmer 5th Peter Ireland 4th Anthony Marston 4th and Stephen Minton had trespassed with their hawks in the
several fields contra ordme Curie And that Charles Wemmer and Hugh Wemmer had trespassed with their hawks among
the fields & sales several tymes And that Thomas Cant hath surcharged wth three sheeps And that Meryles Allen 2nd hath
surcharged wth 10 of the County ground at Cypre cross And that John Chappell 2nd hath surcharged in the fields wth 10
And that Nathamell Sutton 4th hath surcharged wth 10 sheeps openly contra pona And that Elm Cooper 2nd Richard Ward 2nd and John
Dolton 2nd had taken in January And that Gabriel Colwell 6th did keep two cows upon broken ground after demerit contra pona
And that he wolme wth 6th Robert Manton 6th widdow Clarke had bene demerit trespassors wth three cattle And that
Henry Clark 2nd Element Smith 6th Element Brown 2nd and Michuall Reynolds 2nd had surcharged wth horses And that
Edward Warr 2nd John Rowlett 3rd Robert Smyth 4th John Dolton 4th Edward Manton field Jun^r William White head 4th
and William Wemmer 2nd had surcharged the fields wth 3 sheeps And that William Wemmer 2nd Hugh Wemmer 2nd had
neglected in performance of their suite to the Lord Co. Therefore the said several persons are accused and they are to
pay to the Lord the several fines & amercements sett by on their heads

And that this last it was shewen by the homage that Hugh Wemmer 13th day of September 1653 did Surrender into the
hand of the Lord by the hand of James Winton one of the demerits of this manor one messuage or half a yard land
wth the appertenty in Widmington wth 1/2 yard land was formerly Surrendered to the said Hugh by Charles Wemmer his father
to the use of Ellenor Wemmer his widow & assigned for ever upon condition never to be sold that wth the said Hugh his
heires or assigns did pay to the said Ellenor the sum of one hundred p^{er} annu^m all or before the first of January
day of March next ensuing the date of the said Surrender then the said Surrender to be void

And that Peter Wotton 1st time the last Co. did Surrender into the hand of the Lord by the hand of James Hill one
of the demerits of this manor one messuage and one yard wth the appertenty in Widmington to the use of the wife of
William Wemmer and Mary his wife for ever during their natural lives and to the heires and assigns of the
said William for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof granted license to have and to hold the
said cottage & garden wth appertenty unto the said William & Mary during their natural lives and after to
the heires & assigns of the said William for ever all the will of the Lord according to the custome of the
manor afore said rendering to the Lord yearly 4th p^{er} annu^m of Co. and all other services therof due and accustomed
they gave the Lord a fine for their admittance to hold the same hundred shillings and are
admitted Tenent

And that Elm Cooper widdow 1st time the last Co. did Surrender into the hand of the Lord by the hand of Thomas
Smyth one of the demerits of this manor one messuage one cottage & a close wth the appertenty in Widmington
to the use and behoof of Moses Allen his assigns for ever during the term of the natural life of the
said Elm to whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof granted license to have and to hold the said
messuage wth the appertenty unto the said Moses Allen & his assigns during the term of the natural
life of the said Elm all the will of the Lord according to the custome of the manor afore said rendering
to the Lord yearly 7th p^{er} annu^m of Co. and all other services therof due and accustomed they
gave the Lord a fine for their admittance to hold the same hundred shillings and are admitted Tenent

First that Thomas George 12th is a common man but he sold his ale & beer according to the Statute And that John
Warrington and Thomas Godshard 12th have trespassed wth cows & horses in the stallion fields And that William Mubond
hath taken 3 sheeps toman's contra ordme Curie and that Peter Woodroffe son 3rd 4th and Anne Mubond widdow 3rd
hath trespassed the fields wth lambs And that John Kerbie wth may letted to Harry Stone all the common day And
that John Russell 12th widdow Thorge 12th John Kerbie 2nd Thomas George 2nd & Richard Mowbray Jun^r had trespassed
wth three cows in the stallion fields And that Anne Mubond widdow 1st 6th Thomas Godshard 9th had trespassed
wth three hogs Therefore the said several persons are accused and they are to pay to the Lord the several
fines and amercements sett upon their heads

Whereas at the Co. holden for manor afore said the 20th day of April 1654 it was shewen by the
homage that Walter Mubond gent 1st time the last Co. dyed seized of one messuage & a yard land wth the appertenty
in Widmington wth his hold in him & his heires by copy of Co. rolls all the will of the Lord according to the custome
of this manor and that Walter Mubond was his son and heire to the same and was aged nynteen years
thereabouts now at this Co. and the said Walter Mubond the same & desired to be admitted Tenent to
the messuage & yard land by his Steward therof granted license to have and to hold the said
messuage & yard land wth the appertenty unto the said Walter Mubond for ever all the will of the Lord
according to the custome of the manor afore said rendering to the Lord yearly for the said messuage & yard land
5th p^{er} annu^m of Co. and for the said messuage & half a yard land 5th p^{er} annu^m of Co. and all other services therof due and
accustomed they gave the Lord a fine for their admittance to hold the same hundred shillings and are admitted
Tenent
