The Jurors & Homage of Liddington James Winton Robert Boyer James Hill Clement Spritt Lawrence Keyneley Richard Ward William Horne John Jreland George Sowell Thomas Warton Anthony Mastin Gabriel Colwell Anthony Winton and Clement Wyborne they being all of them duly Sworn upon the holy Mybble they find and report as followeth
First That Thomas Winton Baron of Liddington Hugh Spidmore Robert West gent and Zachary Dyllye had not performed their suite at this Court And that William Rubon gent Edmande Simey William Ward Thomas Smyth Mosbe Allyn Henry Clarke Robert Manton William Conyngend John Johnson & John Simey have kept their sheep in the wheate field upon the first Sunday after Mastrimmas contrary to custome and order And that Mosbe Allyn hath distorbed the servants of the Jury And that Francis Baylis hath kept a Stone Colde upon the toman contrary to the Statute And that William Rubon hath plowed y^e of Langland Baulde contrary to the order of this Court And that Thomas Manton hath made many misset mth wth his plow And that Stephen Manton hath plowed awaye mth wild bores Land on Langland And that Thomas Wyden John Doston Laurence Wyborne William Wraym and Thomas Luffe have surcharged the Comon wth Sheepe And that John Wyminghurst hath broke the pounde & there fore entry of them are amerced the first amerced mth upon their heads The wth were sett and imposed by James Hill and Anthony Winton who were sworn Assessoris

And all this Court it was found by the homage that John Seaton who held to him and his heirs by copy of Court Rolle at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the said Manns s^{ince} the last Court dyed thereof soe seized and that Thomas Seaton y^e youngest brother and heir of the said John unto the s^{ince} misset according to the custome of this Manns w^{ch} said Thomas being present at this Court trauced the Lords admittance unto the s^{ince} misset to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin do have and to hold the said s^{ince} misset wth the apurtenances unto the said Thomas Seaton his heirs and assignes for ever at the will of the Lord according to the custome of this Manns rendering to the Lord there fore yearly 7^d Rent suite of Court and all other services therofore due and accustomed hee gave the Lord a Ayn for his admittance to hold the same hath made fealty and is admitted Tenant

And all this Court Thomas Wyden did Surrender into the hands of the Lord by the hands of his Steward all those messuages of land meadows and pastures w^{ch} hee apurtenances in Liddington aforesaid amounted halfe an acre land late the Lands of John Wyden to the use and behoofe of him the said Thomas Wyden and Mary his wife for and during the course of their naturall lives and the life of the longer liver of them and from and after their decease to the use of the heirs of the body of the said Thomas on the body of the said Mary lawfully begotten and for default of such issue to the use of the right heirs of the said Thomas for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin do have and to hold the said s^{ince} misset unto them in manner aforesaid at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the Manns aforesaid rendering therofore yearly to the Lord 2^d Rent suite of Court and all other services therofore due and accustomed they gave the Lord a Ayn for their admittance to hold the same have made fealty and admitted Tenants

And all this Court it was found and presented by the homage of Liddington that John Webster who held by copy of Court Rolle of this Manns at the will of the Lord according to the custome of this Manns one Cottage w^{ch} the apurtenances in Liddington aforesaid in his last will and Testament devised the said Cottage unto Constantine his wife and her heirs who by attending to the custome of this Manns the said Cottage is become forfeited unto the Lord of the Manns after the decease of the said Constantine who hath an estate therein for his life by virtue of a copy of Court Rolle of this Manns

And that John Wysher hath Surrendered into the hands of the Lord of this Manns by the hands of James Dyllye one of the Seneschalls there one messuage w^{ch} a garden honell place and other apurtenances therofore to the use and behoofe of William Wysher and of his heirs assigned for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin do have and to hold the said s^{ince} misset unto the said William Wysher his heirs and assignes for ever at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the said Manns rendering therofore to the Lord yearly 6^d Rent suite of Court and all other services therofore due and accustomed hee gave the Lord a Ayn for his admittance to hold the same hath made fealty and is admitted Tenant

Caldecott The Jurors & Homage Peter Woodroffe Sir William Hill Zachary Ward James Hill Walter Wyborne William Wyminghurst Richard Morris William Sly Robert Woodroffe John Russell Henry Rubon

First That John Wyminghurst hath broken the assize in selling his ale and beere And that John Russell hath broken the assize in selling his bread And that Richard Morris John Rubon and John Kerbede have surcharged the fields wth Sheepe And that John Woodroffe Lawrence Mould have taken these Sheepe Comons in the winter tyme contrary to the order of this Court And that Peter Woodroffe John Wyminghurst and John Kerbede have taken Sheepe Comons for the winter tyme contrary to the order of this Court And that Ann Rubon widow hath not repaired her wantles at a place called Dobs horse And widow Russell and William Rubon have putt their Cowes into the fields after St Thomas contrary to the order of this Court And that Richard Morris the holder hath surcharged in the fields wth Cows therefore they are severally amerced to the Lord the severall amerced sett upon their heads The wth were sett and imposed by Richard Morris and Henry Rubon who were elected and sworn Assessoris

And all this Court it was found by the homage of Caldecott that Thomas Redshaw who held to him and his heirs by copy of Court Rolle of this Manns at the will of the Lord according to the custome of this Manns one Cottage w^{ch} the apurtenances in Caldecott dyed thereof seized and that after the decease of Elizabeth his wife Ann Elizabeth Alice Mary Susan Sarah and Priscilla are Daughters and Coheirs of the said Thomas unto the said Cottage

And all this Court it was found by the homage that William Rubon and Ann his wife the said Ann being solely and secretly examined by the Steward have Surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands of his Steward one doff or tloss and one fullered tloss adjoining to the same being in Snelson and one halfe yard land w^{ch} the apurtenances therofore to be longed bying and being in the fields meadows and place of Caldecott aforesaid heretofore in the occupation of the said William and now in the occupation of Peter Woodroffe gent or of his assignes to the use and behoofe of Peter the said Peter Woodroffe and of his heirs assigned for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin do have and to hold the said s^{ince} misset wth the apurtenances unto the said Peter Woodroffe his heirs and assignes for ever at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the said Manns rendering to the Lord yearly 6^d Rent suite of Court and all other services therofore due and accustomed hee gave the Lord a Ayn for his admittance to hold the same hath made fealty and is admitted Tenant

And all this Court it was found by the homage that Francis German the sonent day of September 1654 did Surrender into the hands of the Lord by the hands of William Rubon one of the Seneschalls of this Manns one messuage and one halfe yard w^{ch} the apurtenances in Caldecott to the use following (that is to say) to the use of Jane wife of the said Francis for the course of Com years to comence immediately from and after the decease of the said Francis And from and after the expiration of the said course of Com years then as to and concerning the messuage next to the gate the tham box or bar the same the sitting kil and orchard belonging to w^{ch} of the said messuage to the use of the said Jane for & during her naturall widowhood and one messuage of the said halfe yard land to the said Jane during her naturall life And the said Francis German and Jane and of his heirs and assignes for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin do have and to hold the said s^{ince} misset wth the apurtenances unto the said Jane and Francis the sonne to the use of Jane in manner and forme aforesaid at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the said Manns rendering to the Lord yearly 6^d Rent suite of Court and all other services therofore due and accustomed they gave the Lord a Ayn for admittance Jane hath made fealty but the fealty of Francis is respited until hee be of age
