

Siddington eus^t Hit the Court Leet and Court Baron of the right hono^{ble} John Earle of Exeter Baron of Burleigh there houlden the enelouth day ^{of April} In the yere of our Lord God one thousand and six
hundre^t fiftie and eight By the Steward there it was quorrelled as followeth /

The Jurys homages James Minton Robert Boyer James Hill Clement Pittard Lawrence Keyndt Richard Ward William Horne John Freeland George Sewell Thomas Warren Cluttony Mastin
of Luddington & Gabriell Colwell Anthony Minton and Clement Brynond they being all off them July 3vno upon the holy Bible they made and spent as followeth

First that the Thomas Burton ¹² Baronet John Wild bore ¹² Hugh Pridmore Robert Paston ¹² gent and Anthony Olyffe ¹² had not performed their suit to all this Court And that William Nunbore
gent Edmonde Sisney William Ward ¹² Thomas Smyth Moses Allyn ¹² Henry Clark ¹² Robert Manton ¹² William Cowper ¹² John Johnson ¹² John Sisney had kept their sheep in the roade laid
after the first survey after Martinmas contrary to custome and order And that Moses Allyn ¹² hath disclosed the secrete of the Jury And that Frauncis Bayliss hath kept a stoned Ceste
upon this tomon contrary to the Statute And that William Nunbore hath plowed yd off Langland Baule contrary to the order off this Court And that Thomas Manton ¹²⁻⁶ hath made many
mireys in ¹² wth his plow And that Stephen Manton ¹²⁻⁶ hath plowed away m¹² Wildbore's Land on Langlands And that Thomas Baydon ¹² John Dolton ¹² Laurence Brown ¹² William Warren ¹²
and Thomas Lant ¹² have surcharged the common wth Sheep And that John Wimblett ¹²⁻⁶ hath broke the yownde Chorlford entry of them and smotred the stede amtriam ¹² sett
upon their heads The ryver w¹² sett and imposed by James Hill and Anthony Manton who were sevnd Assessors.

And att this Court it was found by the homage that John Beaton who held to him and his one Cottag w^t thaptertent to him and his heirs by copy of Court Roll att the will
of the Lord according to the custome of the said Mannie since the last Court dyed therof so seised And that Thomas Beaton ys yongest brother and heire of the said John unto the
x^t mth anno according to the custome of this Mannie w^t & said Thomas being present at this Court transire the lords admittant to the x^t mth to whom the Lord by his steward hath
therof granted leizm^t to haue and to hould the said Cottag w^t thaptertent unto the said Thomas Beaton his heirs and assignes for ever att the will of the Lord according
to the custome of the said Mannie rendering to the lord therof yearly n^t Rent sume of 6d and all other seruices therof due and accustomed he gaue the lre a
And for his admittant to hould the same hath made &aultid and is admitted indent.

And at this Court Thomas Roroden did surrenders into the hands of the Lord by the hands of his Steward all those yds of land meadow and pasture wch thare agst tenement in Ludington
aforesaid attested hulfe a yard land late the lands of John Roroden to the r'ly and behoofe of him the said Thomas Roroden and Mary his wife for and during the tyme of thair
natural life and the lyfe of the longere luyne of them and from and after thair decess to r'ly of the body of the said Thomas on the body of the said Mary lawfully
begotten and for default of such yds to the r'ly of the eight heire of the said Thomas for whom the Lord by his steward hath theron granted sitz in his hand and to hould
the said yds missis onto them in manner & forme abovesaid att the will of the Lord according to the custome of this maner aforesaid rendering tharefor yearly to the Lord v' Rent
yds of leyd and all other sumtes therfore and att ftemed they quod the lord attende for thare admittance to hould the same haud made fully paid admitted Donants

And att this point it was found and presented by the homage of Liddington that John Webster who held by copy of De Rolle of this manor all the will of the lord according to the custom
of this manor and cottage now thairtene in Liddington aforesaid in his life time by his last will and testamēt devised the said cottage unto Constant his wife and her heirs wherby
according to the customs of this manor the said cottage is becomē forfeited unto the lord of the manor after the deceasē of the said Constant who hath an estate therein for his life
By vertue of a copy of De Rolle of this manor

By witness of a copy, of the Roll of the Manors
And that John Fisher hath surrendered into the hands of the lord of this manor by the hands of James Egerton and of the chamberlains there and howse yle of a messuage w^t a barn
honest place^{w^t the litle of myghte t^e regne} and other appurtenances thereto belonging to the use and behoofe of William Fisher and of his heirs assygned for ever to whom the lord by his steward hath thidt granted
said in the said hand and to hold the said premises unto the said William Fisher his heirs and assygnes for ever at the will of the lord according to the custome of the said manor rendering
therefore to the lord yearly by Rent sum of £ 10 and all other summes therof due or amissone hee gaue the lord a fyre for his admittance to hold the same with madd Adalthe
and is admitted & done

The Jurers & homage of Peter Woodroffe son William & Nathary Ward Jamon & Will Walter Newbone William Brimfins & Richard Morris William Sly Robert Woodroffe John Russel Henry Nutson
John Woodroffe son Edmund Green etc being all July 2000 upon the holt rayble they finde and present as followeth

Art that John Brinchurst hath broken the assize in setting his ale and bode And that John Russell¹² hath broken the assize in setting his bread And that Richard Morris⁵ John
Rubens³⁶ and John Herbie⁵ have surcharged the Ale by shodope And that John Woodtoft²⁰ Lawrence Mould¹² have taken thone shodope Comons in the winter tym contrary to the order
order of this court And that Peter Woodtoft²¹ & Willm Wringfins¹² have taken shodope Comons for the winter tym contrary to the order of this court And that Eliz Rubens¹²
widow hath not repaired her Wantys at a place tyed to do so hysse And widow Russell²⁶ and Willm Rubens¹² have putt their Comons into the Ale by after St Thomas tyme
to the order of this court And that Richard Morris⁶ holder hath surcharged in the Ale by shodope Comons & soale Shadford they are severally amoneted to the lord the seuerall amonents
set upon thone heads & he w^t were sett and imposed by Richard Morris and Henry Rubens who were setled and severnd afterw^d

set upon thone heads ther w^t were sett and imposed by Richard Morris and Henry Nunbone who were & lot^{ed} and sworne affdro^s
And at this Court it was found by the homage of Caldecott that Thomas Rodshawe who held to him and his heires by copy of Cst Roll^d of this manor at the will of
the Lord according to the custome of this manor and Cottag^e re^t that in Caldecott dyed therof 31st and that after the deces^s of Elizabeth his wife sum Elizabeth
Alid Mary susan Sarah and Priscilla are daught^r and heires of the said Thomas unto the said Cottag^e

And Mary Siston Sarah and Priscilla are Daughters and Heiresses of the said Thomas unto the said Cottages
And at this Court it was found by the homage that William Nunbord and Clem his wife the said Clem being solely and secretly examined by the Steward have surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands of his Steward one Cott or loss and one Fullorod & lost adwyring to the same lying in Sinston and one halfe yard land wch the aperntures therunto belonging lying and being in the field meadowes and plotes of Balderton aforesaid heretofore in the occupation of the said William and now in the occupation of Peter Wood tot he gant or of his assignes to the vs and behoofe of Peter the said Peter Wood tot he and of his heirs assignes for ever whom the Lord by his Steward hath therof granted to him to have and to hold the said place wch the apernture onto the said Peter Wood tot he his heirs and assignes for ever at the will of the Lord according to the custome of the said place Considering to the Lord yearly to have suitt of 20 gall other somites therfore I do command hee gaue the Lord a fynd for his admittance to have the same farr made staltie and to admittit remont

At same huse made Statute and it admittede eonent
And att this Court it was found by the somage that Arantrie Forman the sonente day of September 1654 did summoner into the hands of the cur by the hands of Walter Grubond
one of the seruantes of this Masse one plough and one halfe yard w^t the pinte in Goldcott to the vsse following (that is to say) in the vse of land w^t the said Arantrie
for the summe of 20m yarde to comende yearly from and after the firste of the said feare And from and after the expiracion of the said termes of 20m yarde
then as to and concerning the other parlour next to the ch^tre, the chamber above the same the kitchyn kil and orchard beloninge to yole of the said messager to the vse of the
said land for ydning her w^t on hood and o^t moyste of the said halfe yard land to the said land during her naturall lyfe and the renderinge theron of the p^t 100
as the estate to the said Jane shull and determine to the vsse of Arantrie and land and of his heires and assignees for tyme to whom
the land by his seruante Ruth Hordot granted. Item to haue and to hold the said p^t 100^t thaynted onto the said land and Arantrie shull come to her to be em
mune and forme abouesaid att the will of the lord according to the custome of the said Masse rendering to the lord yearly 20 p^t 100^t of le^t exchequer Forman therfore
and waftomed they gaue the lord a synd for admittance and huse made ready but the Adalthe of Arantrie is respiled until hee be of age
