Liddington cum Caldecott 11th the Court Leet and Court Baron of the Right Honorable John Earle of Exeter Baron of Burleigh there holden the Twentieth day of October in the year of our Lord Christ 1659 by the Steward there it was enrolled as followeth

First that Robert Weyen and Thomas Werrum one suite to this Court and all this day made default And that Stephen Cottonick hath deceased in a Court in the parish of St. Andrew and Margaret St. widow hath deceased in the parish of St. Andrew And that William Ware Robert Groland Robert Weyen Clement Perithe Robert Hunter John Johnson William Cornwell William Gorden Robert Lyster for being horses found in the parish of St. Andrew contrary to the order of this Court And that Robert Groland hath not made his part in the meadow gate and that Margaret St. widow hath not made her part in the parish of St. Andrew And that Edward Waterfield the elder hath digged up the high way that leadeth to the parish of St. Andrew By James Werrum and James Gre being sworn afferors

And all this Court came Richard Ward and Elizabeth his wife the said Elizabeth being solely and strictly examined by the Steward and did surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of his Steward one messuage with the appurtenances in Liddington do the use and behoofe of Richard Ward there some and of his heirs and assigns for ever all the will of the lord according to the custom of this Manor rendering to the lord yearly in Rent suits of

And all this Court it was found by the homage that about six years since Thomas Derwit dyed seized of one cottage and three acres of land in Liddington with some other tenements and children to the said Thomas Derwit with the said Elizabeth and Alice are since deceased so as the said cottage and three acres of land are now descended and come to the said Sarah as heirs to her said father and sisters deceased And the said Sarah Derwit being present at this Court desired to be admitted Tenant to the said cottage and three acres of land to whom the lord saving to Elizabeth her mother of the said Sarah suit

First that John Russell hath broke the assize in selling his bread And that John Broughnuff and widow Russell have broken the powder And that Ann Hubbard widow hath surcharged the Comon with two cows And that the said Ann Hubbard hath bred a common Draycrosse with her Cowes And that Thomas Carter hath broken the assize of Bullock contrary to the order of this Court And that William Hubbard and John Broughnuff for keeping their cattle beside their own ground before harvest was found And that George Woodcock hath dammed an ancient watercourse all a plain tilling Bank for long And that John Corbie hath explored up Greenesward contrary to the Statutes And that John Corbie hath not made his part all Short trossle And that Richard Morris hath not made his part all Milkens And that George Woodcock Nicholas Woodcock and widow Ward have explored up Greenesward And that widow Russell hath explored in Northholme And that George Sheppard and others of Liddington have not bound the watercourse between Caldecott withers and Liddington meadow Bridges therefore they are amerced to the lord the several fines and amerced sett upon their heads

 at the will of the Lord according to the custom of the said Manor rendering to the Lord yearly Rent such of Calverton
 as is therein contained and accustomed they gave the Lord a fine for their admittance to hold the said seign and maner with the quarters
