at the pithen end of the Churche had ligned And that Moses Allen hath encroached by plowing all a plute tuffe Olyt p^resse in the northern field of
Ludington And that Robert Manton Robert Roberts & Robert Carter have & is charged wth their Cowes in drudging them to the park And that William
Hether John Hether & Richard Hether have surcharged in the Arid wth hayfe And that William Rubone gent^l hath continued an int^ru^sion all Lang leud baulke
This fore they are amerced and fynyed to the lord the sone all fynyed sett upon their heads by the whole jury

All this Court came Thomas Castellme and Mary his wife the said Mary being solely and secretly examined by the Steward) And did Surrender
into the hands of the lord by the hands of his Steward part of a messuage or tenement in Ludington afore said late Euisard Stangitt and now in the occupation
of William Hill & the wife and behooke of Ann flagitt the wife of George flagitt and of his heires and assignes for ever to whom the lord by his Steward
hath thereof granted seizin To have and to hold the said part of the said messuage unto the said Ann flagitt her heires and assignes for ever all the
will of the lord according to the custome of the said Manor rendering to the lord yearly 2^d Kent suite of toll and all other services therofore due and
assumed shee gave the lord a fyne for her admittance to hold the same hath made healthie oib admitted content And after all this same Court the
said Ann flagitt surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of his Steward the said part of the said messuage and pmisses to the use of the said
Ann flagitt and George flagitt her husband for and during the term of thire natural ludy And after thire decess the use of the house of thire
Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin To have and to hold the said messuage unto the said George flagitt and Ann thire heires and assignes for ever to whom the
lord hath thereof granted seizin To have and to hold the said messuage to the use of the said George flagitt and Ann and the heires of thire two bodies
lawfully begotten and for want of such issue to the use of the said George flagitt and Ann thire heires and assignes for ever all the will of the lord according to the custome
of the said Manor rendering to the lord yearly 2^d Kent suite of toll and all other services therofore due and assumed shee gave the lord a fyne for
there admittance to have the same hath made healthie and is admitted content

And all this Court it was founde by the homage that William Sly hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Hill one of the Dertmarcs
of this Manor that Moxra of seven and twenty acres of land meadow and pasture lying in the Arid of Ludington afore said and assigned halfe a yard land
now on late in the occupation of James Exlett and Stephen Manton or one of them To the use and behooke of Leonard Sparke and of his heires and assignes
for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin To have and to hold the said messuage and pmisses unto the said Leonard
Sparke his heires and assignes for ever all the will of the lord according to the custome of the said Manor rendering to the lord yearly 1st of Kent suite of
toll and all other services therofore due and assumed shee gave the lord a fyne for her admittance to hold the same hath made healthie and is admitted
content

And all this Court the lord by his Steward did grant seizin unto Nicholas Jordan of one Cottage wth the appurtenances in Ludington wth did lately
not only in the lord by and after the decess of John Webster decessed who dyed wth the said cottage But likewise became forfeited to the lord for that
the said John Webster in his life tyme did demise the same in and by his last will and testament contrary to the custome of this Manor To have and to
hold the said Cottage wth the appurtenances unto the said Nicholas Jordan his heires and assignes for ever all the will of the lord according to the
custome of the said Manor rendering to the lord yearly 7th of Kent suite of toll and all other services therofore due and assumed shee gave the
lord a fyne for her admittance to hold the same hath made healthie and is admitted content

And all this Court it was founde by the homage that Sarah Jevett hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Winton one of the Dertmarcs
of this Manor all those three acres of land lye and pasture lying in the Arid of Ludington afore said now on late in the occupation of
And all her estate tytle and p^resention of in and unto one Cottage wth the appurtenances in Ludington afore said now on late in the occupation of
or of her assignes To the use and behooke of Symon Cole and of his heires and assignes for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin
To have and to hold the said messuage wth the appurtenances in manner as above said unto the said Symon Cole his heires and assignes for ever all the will of
the lord according to the custome of the said Manor rendering to the lord yearly 7th of Kent suite of toll and all other services therofore due and assumed
shee gave the lord a fyne for her admittance to hold the same hath made healthie and is admitted content

And all this Court it was founde by the homage that Judith Court widow hath surrendered into the hands of the lord by the hands of James Exlett one of
the Dertmarcs of this Manor one lye and a butting upon the park walle wth pasture land lying on both sides and one lye lying at the Wester p^rty being the same
lye from the persons lye westward and abutting to the meadow site wth the appurtenances in Ludington To the use of her heires and assignes for ever
to the use of John Cant his heires and assignes for ever To the use of the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted seizin To have and to hold the
said lye and lye unto the said Judith and John in manner as above said all the will of the lord according to the custome of the said Manor rendering
to the lord yearly 7th of Kent suite of toll and all other services therofore due and assumed shee gave the lord a fyne for her admittance and was admitted

Dertmarcs of this Manor one hood of meadow lying at Kynholme in Caldecott afore said formerly p^rtyl of an halfe yard land now in the occupation of Wm Rubone for
To the use and behooke of William Rubone the other & now Rubone his heires and assignes for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath thereof granted
seizin To have and to hold the said hood of meadow to the said William Rubone and William Rubone thire heires and assignes for
ever all the will of the lord according to the custome of the said Manor rendering to the lord the 1st of Kent & services therofore due and assumed shee
gave the lord a fyne and is admitted content
