Thomas Russell of Walsorpe in the County of

Toft in fullson vizing Toft gate one yard land be-  
longing to it with several acres of land pasture  
and meadow, containing by estimation eight town  
acres and a half and about the year some more or  
less as it is set out by tax with the Apurton and  
belonging to his half yard land and late in the  
occupation of the afore said Thomas Russell and his  
surrender of Thomas Russell doo make to the said  
also and be goods of Robert Sly of Walsorpe  
in the County of Leicestershire yeoman and to his  
rights and assigns for ever according to the  
Custom of the afore said manor
