The first day of October. Anno Domini 1677.

The day and yeare above written Thomas Palmer
of Hornemighold in the Countie of Leicesters did
Surrender into the hands of the Lord of the Mannor
of Siddington aforesaid by the hands of Robert
Ireland one of the Defenders thereof halfe one Cottage
being the south end now in the occupation of John
freeman with all the appurtenances belonging unto
halfe a Cottage as it is now divided. The said
Thomas Palmer is to keepe the fence from Godbrooks
barne to the well, and Robert Allen is to keepe the
fence from the well to the marks on the four wall
The said Thomas is to have eyres and weyres for
Carting through the gates and so far as his fire
four wall goeth: And this Surrender the above
said Thomas Palmer made to the use & behoofe
of the above said Robert Allen and of his heires
and assigns forever according to the Custom of
the said Mannor.

Mannor & arable lands the Custom there & the half acre
of arable land lying in the Middle field in Liddington
of one acre being a Head land & shrotoys East & west
& heading of a gross of furrows there & the other half
acre more of arable lying in y^e same field shrotoys
also East & west of Lands of John Sifney South
and the half acre more of arable lying in y^e another
field in Liddington of one acre shrotoys with westward
to the southward & the other half of y^e west of Land of
John Sifney Southward & y^e other west of Land there
of Laurence Heywold Southward with all & by the
agreement & to the use & behoof of Robert Smyth
y^e younger Son of y^e said Robert y^e elder & of his
heir & assigns for ever & arable lands in y^e Custom of
y^e same Mannor & arable lands with all & furrows
y^e said Robert & his heirs & assigns of right arable lands.
