At the Court of the Baron of the right hono<sup>ble</sup> John Earle of Exeter Baron of Burleigh there  
was holden the one & twentieth day of April in the year of our Lord Christ 1539 By the steward there  
it was Inrolled as followeth. It is thus founde by the homage that James Kerbid hath  
surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands of Walter Lubond one of the stewards of this  
Mannor and doth in gnosson one halfe yard land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Caldercott to the use following  
(that is to say) to the use of Mary Kerbid wife of the said James untill Thomas sonne of the  
said James shall attain his age of one & twentieth years And after then ab to one mo<sup>tye</sup> of the  
p<sup>re</sup>misses to the use of the said Mary for & during the term of her natural life & after her  
decease then to the use of the said Thomas and of his heires and assignes for ever And as to the other  
mo<sup>tye</sup> of the said p<sup>re</sup>misses to the use & behoofe of the said Thomas his heires and assignes for ever  
to whom the Lord by his steward hath the same granted & given to have & to hold the said p<sup>re</sup>misses w<sup>th</sup> the  
appurtenances to the said Mary and Thomas in manner as abovesaid all the will of the Lord according to  
the custome of the said Mannor & during to the Lord yearly & rent quite of 10<sup>s</sup> & all other services  
therefore due & accustomed they gave the Lord a fine for their admittance of Mary hath made  
fealty & they are admitted tenants:)

Memorandum The day and years above written Robert Ireland  
surrendered into the hands of the Lord of the manor aforesaid  
by the hands of Thomas Manton one of the Justices thereof three  
certain parcels of land lay and moor in the fields and territories  
of Liddington aforesaid containing by estimation one acre  
and one rood be the same more or less. And this surrender  
he made to the use and behoof of John Beoby gent and of his  
heires and assigns forever according to the Custom of the said  
manor

Upon condition notwithstanding that if the above said Robert Ireland his  
heires executors administrators or any of them doe well and truly pay  
or cause to be paid unto the above named John Beoby gent or to his  
heires executors administrators or assigns the full and just sum  
of forty pounds of good and lawful money of England at or upon  
the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September next ensuing the day of the date  
of the above said surrender at or within the now dwelling house  
of the said John Beoby gent situate in Liddington aforesaid in the  
County of Rutland that then the above said surrender to be void  
or else to stand and be in force and vertue
