Memorandum the day and yeare above written, that
I Robert Smith the Younger do surrender into the Hands
of the Lord of the Mannor, by the Hands of Thomas Manton
one of the Deciners of the said Mannor, two Acres of Land,
which was formerly my Fathers, one Acre shooting into Wester
Sieke, M^r Beech lying on the South side with one halfe Acre:
and one halfe Acre in the same furlong, M^r Sismy lying North
West; and one halfe Acre shooting into Bryerland Sieke, M^r
Ridgeley lying on the South: and one halfe Acre, headland
Apes Crosse furlong, shooting East and West. To the Use and
Behoofe of me the said Robert Smith, and of Judeth my
Wife, during our Naturall Lives, and after our decease to
the Use and behoof of the Heires of our two Bodies lawfully
begotten. and for the want of such heires. then to the Use
and behoof of the heires of me the said Robert Smith
for ever according to the Custom of the said Mannor.

this proviso & condition that if the said Robert
Boyer or Elizabeth his wife their heirs or assigns or any
of them do or shall woe & convey pay or cause to be
paid unto the said Magdalene daughter of Nottingham
her or their adm^r or assigns the full & entire sum of forty
pounds of good lawfull money of England wth the
lawfull interest & interest thereof of the money
on the twentieth day of August in the year of our
Lord & King One thousand six hundred eighty one
then this instrument to be void & of no effect.
