which was formerly my Fathers, one Acre shooting into Wester
Sieke, Mr Beeby lying on the South side with one halfe Acre:
and one halfe Acre in the same furlong, Mr Sismy lying North
West; and one halfe Acre shooting into Bryerland Sieke, Mr
Ridgeley lying on the South: and one halfe Acre, headlanding
Apes Crose furlong, shooting East and West. To the Use and
