Clarke shall take effect immediately from the date
the solemnization of the said marriage intended & then to the
use & behoof of the said Henry Clarke & Anne his wife for
and during the term of their lives & the life of the longer lived
of them & from & after their decease & deceases then to the use
& behoof of the said Nicholas Manton his heirs & assigns for ever
provided always that the life & upon this condition that
if William Featherston of Osgby withon in the County of Northampton
his son & nephew to the said Henry Clarke his heirs & assigns
shall ever wilfully pay or cause to be paid any part of the
said assigned to full sum of one hundred pounds of good
& lawfull money of England wth in one year next after
the decease & deceases of the said Henry Clarke & Anne his
said wife then the s^rward to be void & of none effect to
the said Nicholas Manton & his heirs & assigns to
be reman'd & to the use & behoof of the said William
Featherston his heirs & assigns for ever according
to the custom of the said Mannor.

Upon the payment of the above said sum of
one hundred pounds of the said Henry
Clarke in his life by me unto the said Nicholas
Manton then the s^rward to be voidable
at his will

The day and yeare above written Henry Clarke did surrender into the hands of the lord by the hands of Lawrence Teanoldes one of the deacons thereof after the decease of him the said Henry and Ann his wyfe One halfe yard land with all the appurtenances therunto belonging Now in the tenure & occupacion of him the said Henry lying & being in the feilds and territories of Siddington aforesaid, And this Surrender he made to the use & behoofe of Nicholas Manton of Charge in the Countie of Rutland and of his heires or assignes forever according to the Custom of the said manor, Provided alwayes neuertheless & upon this Condition that yf William Featherston of Collingston in the Countie of Northampton Husband man (Nephew to the said Henry Clarke) his heires executor or administrat^r shal & doe w^{ch} and truly pay or cause to be payd unto the said Nicholas Manton his executor administrat^r or assignes the full Sum of one hundred poundes of good & lawful money of England within one yeare next after the decease and deceases of the said Henry Clarke & Ann his wyfe, then this surrender to be void & of non effect to the said Nicholas Manton & his heires or assignes. And afterwards the said Henry Clarke doth Surrender all the premises abovesaid to the sole use and behoofe of the said William Featherston and his heires or assignes for ever according to the Custom of the said manor.

If the said Henry Clarke pay the abovesaid Sum of One hundred poundes by his life unto the said Nicholas Manton that then those abovesaid Surrenders shal be revokeable at the will and pleasure of the said Henry.
