And at that tyme the said John de Clerk did surrender into the hand of the lord by the hand of his steward  
one dwelling house on the north side of the church other apartments thereto be longing in Lyddington aforesaid at the same  
is now divided and is now in the occupation of John Stroton to the use & behoof of the lady John Stroton & Jane his  
wife for the term of thier natural lives and after thier deceses to the use of John Stroton & some of the lady John & Jane  
of his honours and assigned for ever to whomsoever by his steward hath therof granted he may to have & to hold the  
said premises to the use aforesaid all the while of the lord according to the custome of the maner aforesaid  
rendering to the lord yearly one penny rent suit of all & they gave the lord a fine for admittance of the same made  
the said care admitted herof
