the Court Lord and Const Baron of the right hon<sup>ble</sup> John Earl of Exeter Baron of Burleigh there holden the 25<sup>th</sup> day of  
October in the yeere of our lord Christ 1658 by the Steward thereof it was Juried as followeth

**Caldecott** Thomas Warren Robert Boyer Clement Smith Clement Brown John Johnson Anthony Master Stephen Manton Anthony Hill  
Laurent Keynoly Edward Watsworth John Horner Anthony Winter & George Serod they being all of them duly

**First** that Thomas Winton John Willcox Hugh Primrose William Rychon Richard Wright & Thomas Eastland have not performed their duties  
and services at the Court And that William Downford William Gonne Thomas Aredman John Dolton William Housifon have discharged in the  
fields w<sup>th</sup> horses And that Stephen Wright & Thomas Boyden have surrendred the tynage w<sup>th</sup> sheep And that widow Manton hath performed her  
duties to the King her same contrary to the order of this Court And that John the vic<sup>r</sup> of Michaelburn hath disobeyed contrary to the order of this Court And that  
Thomas Aredman hath neglected the water & hath not repayed his Chymney And that widow Cunt hath neglected the water And that Edward  
Clunke contrary to the instment of this Manno hath refused to pay his head felner And that William Rubens gent hath continued to plow & graze  
of Langland Bault to his owne Land And that M<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth Johnson & Shroppe have disobeyed upon the pepper pastures & have forced one of  
them and amerced to pay unto the lord the pecuniary amercement sett upon their heads By Edmund Symey & Clement Smith who were Sworne Stewards

And that all this Court came Sarah Blythe and William Rubens gent and surrounded into the hands of the lord by the hands of his Steward and M<sup>r</sup> William  
and rest and one yard land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Liddington a freehold containing by estimation one messuagge and one half twenty six acres of land  
flour acres of meadow & six acres of pasture to the use and behoofe of Lawrence Forth and of his heirs and assigns for ever to whom the lord by  
his Steward hath therof granted seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Lawrence Forth his heirs and assigns for ever at the  
will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly 4<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> and all other services thereunto due and accustomed  
his gave the lord a fine for his admittance and was admitted And afterwards to wit all this tory lo<sup>rd</sup> with Michael Reynolds and  
Domaundeth against the said Lawrence de placito tra<sup>ct</sup> concerning the aforesaid messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of  
meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Liddington aforesaid holden of the Manno aforesaid by copy of Court Rolle of the same Manno  
And makes the w<sup>th</sup> statute to p<sup>er</sup>tinent that plaint in forme and nature of a writ of entry upon seizin in the po<sup>er</sup> of the said Michael  
Reynolds in his proper person domaund against the said Lawrence Forth the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and  
six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances of this Court at his right and inheritance And into w<sup>th</sup> the said Lawrence hath not entered unless by  
disseizin w<sup>th</sup> Hugh Hunt therof in writte and without judgment hath made to the said Lawrence w<sup>th</sup> thirty yeeres now last past et And whereas  
the said Lawrence has been seized of the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances  
in his domaunde as of fee and of right at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno taking thereof the profit to the value of  
one shilling And therof hee bringeth suite And the aforesaid Lawrence in his proper person comes and defendes his right when et And calls therof  
to warranty Sarah Blythe and William Rubens who and went before the Court in their proper persons and shewed they warrant unto him the said messuagge & one  
half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances et And upon this the said Michael domaunde against  
the said Sarah Blythe and William Rubens & denoneth by their warranty the aforesaid messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and  
six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances wherupon they saye that they were seized of the said premises w<sup>th</sup> their appurtenances in their domaunde as of fee  
and of right at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno in the tyme of george in the tyme of Charles late King of England  
taking thereof the profit to the value of one shilling et And therof they bringe suite et And the aforesaid Sarah & William denoneth by their warranty  
to defende their right et when et And moreover therof calls to warranty John Burfiall who also is p<sup>er</sup>sent before the Court in his proper person and sheweth he  
warranteth to them the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances And upon this  
the said Michael domaunde against him the said John Burfiall denoneth by his warranty the said premises w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances wherupon hee sayeth hee was  
seized of the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in his domaunde as of  
fee and of right at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno in the tyme of george in the tyme of Charles late King of England  
taking thereof the profit to the value of one shilling et And therof they bringe suite et And the aforesaid John Burfiall w<sup>th</sup> lyente therof to  
warranteth until three yeeres after the tyme of the tresp<sup>er</sup> et And hee hath it et And the said Michael Reynolds herein cometh against to this Court  
in his proper person and the said John Burfiall although hee is called came not but in contempt of the Court hath dopted and made default  
therofore it is considered that the aforesaid Michael de Reynold his seizin against the said Lawrence Forth of the aforesaid messuagge & one half twenty six  
acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances And that the said Lawrence Forth may have of the lands of the said  
Sarah Blythe and William Rubens to be it a fine et And moreover that the said Sarah & William may have of the lands of the said John Burfiall to the  
value of et And the said John Burfiall in w<sup>th</sup> et And upon this the said Michael requirith a p<sup>ro</sup>cept of habere facias to him and it is  
granted retornable here without delay et And afterwards to wit on the same 25<sup>th</sup> day of october comes before the said Michael in his proper person and a  
servant of the Court to wit Richard Hays the said Michael the Court that hee by virtue of the p<sup>ro</sup>cept aforesaid to him directed the said fine  
eventh day of october was caused to have to the said Michael Reynolds full seizin of the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres  
of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances by the said p<sup>ro</sup>cept to him was domaunded And afterwards at this same Court  
the said Michael Reynolds Lawrence Forth Sarah Blythe and William Rubens came in their own persons and surrounded into the hands of the lord by the  
hands of his said Steward in the same Court the said messuagge & one half twenty six acres of land flour acres of meadow and six acres of pasture w<sup>th</sup>  
the appurtenances to the use & behoofe of the said Lawrence Forth and of his heirs and assigns for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath  
therof granted seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Lawrence Forth his heirs and assigns for ever at the  
will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly 4<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> and all other services thereunto due  
and accustomed his gave the lord a fine for his admittance and was admitted & denoneth

The Jurors & Homagers  
**Caldecott** John Kirby Robert Sly Duncann Hill Tho. Arent Chamberleyne being duly Sworne on the holy Evangelists they Juried as followeth

**First** that Duncann Hill Am Rubens widow Richard Morris John have lost their lands contrary to the payne of the Court And that the said Am Rubens  
have trespassed in the sturall Aveley And that widow Redshawe Thomas George John Burghurst and widow Guyman have layd out their beasts in the Aveley at vnder  
tynage And that Robert Woodroffe Nicholas Morris George Woodroffe John Hill John Burghurst John Russell John Kirby & John Russell Jun  
M<sup>r</sup> Rubens and William Rubens have dyed their herijes on the gate & pasture contra ordinem Curie And that John Russell & Thomas Roberts  
have broken the clipp of bread And that Richard Morris John Russell baken and William Rubens are comen trespassors And that widow Russell hath letten her sheep to come in the  
winter contra ordinem Curie And that Edward Wines John Woodroffe and John Rubens have lost cattle of them a piece housing w<sup>th</sup> right of comen for them  
therofore they are amerced to pay to the lord the pecuniary amercement sett upon their heads By Robert Woodroffe & John Kirby Apperons Jur

And all this Court it was Juried by the homage of Caldecott that Richard Morris sen hath surrounded into the hands of the lord by the hands of Walter Rubens  
one of the messuagges of this Manno one messuagge and one half yard land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Caldecott to the use of Nicholas Morris his heirs  
and assigns for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath therof granted seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Nicholas Morris his  
heirs and assigns for ever at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly 4<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> and all other  
services thereunto due and accustomed his gave the lord a fine for his admittance et hath made fealty and is admitted & denoneth

And that the said Richard Morris hath surrounded into the hands of the lord by the hands of the said Walter Rubens three acres of Arable Land bound by  
the of Thomas Woodroffe yard land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Caldecott to the use and behoofe of Ellenor Morris his wife for the Decenne of her natural life and  
after her decease to the use of Nicholas Morris his Sonne and of his heirs and assigns for ever to whom the lord by his Steward hath therof granted  
seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto Ellenor and Nicholas in manner above said at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno  
rendering to the lord yearly 12<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> et they gave the lord a fine for their admittance et have made fealty and are admitted & denoneth

And that the said Richard Morris hath surrounded into the hands of the lord by the hands of the said Walter Rubens three acres of Arable Land and  
pasture and one acre of meadow formerly belonging to a Cottage some tyme Zachary Rubens w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Caldecott aforesaid to the use and behoofe of  
Ellenor Morris his wife for the Decenne of her natural life and after her decease to the use of Nicholas Morris his Sonne and of his heirs and assigns for ever to  
whome the lord by his Steward hath therof granted seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Ellenor and Nicholas and the heirs and  
assignes of the said Nicholas in manner above said at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly  
12<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> et they gave the lord a fine for their admittance et have made fealty and are admitted & denoneth

And all this Court Nicholas Morris surrounded into the hands of the lord by the hands of his Steward and part of an orchard and garden next to Peter Woodroffe  
wall and the same is now sett out & divided from the other p<sup>ar</sup>t thereof being p<sup>ar</sup>t of a messuagge & homestead in Caldecott now the occupation of the said Nicholas de libertie  
of his grosse & disse and regress into and from the same to the use of Ellenor Morris his mother for the Decenne of her natural life to whom the lord by  
his Steward hath therof granted seizin to have and to hold the said premises unto the said Ellenor for the Decenne of her natural life at the will of the  
lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly 4<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> et shee gave a fine for her admittance and is admitted & denoneth  
And all this Court it was Juried by the homage that Robert Sealborne who held to him and his heirs by copy of Court Rolle at the will of the lord according to the Customs of the  
Manno one messuagge and one third part of a yard land w<sup>th</sup> the appurtenances in Caldecott since the last Court had therof seized and that Robert Sealborne is his  
youngest Sonne and heere to the same according to the Customs of the Manno when hee made admittance to the land by his Steward hath granted him seizin  
therof to have and to hold the said messuagge and third part of a yard land unto the said Robert Sealborne his heirs and assigns for ever at the will  
of the lord according to the Customs of the said Manno rendering to the lord yearly 4<sup>th</sup> Rent suite of 6<sup>th</sup> et hee gave the lord a fine for his admittance and  
is admitted & denoneth

And that the said Robert Scudborne the elder hath Surrendered into the hands of the Lord by the hands of Robert Sly, one of the Demourant of this manor and Cott in Snettles and one halfe yard land thereto belonging wch the apartments in Coldcroft to the use and behoofe of Walter Scudborne his Sonne and of his heirs and assigned for ever to whom the Lord by his Steward hath thereof granted Seizin to have and to hold the said Cott halfe yard land and premises wch the apartments unto the said Walter Scudborne his Sonne and assigns for ever at the will of the Lord according to the Custome of the said manor rendering to the Lord yearly 5<sup>s</sup> Rent suite of 0<sup>s</sup> 4<sup>d</sup> and other services therofore due and accustomed he gave the Lord a fine for his admittance to have the same hath made Fealty and is admitted Donant.

At this Court it was Certified that Ann Winter an Infant of the age of threene years on threabonter a Donant of certain Customary land and Donant holden of the Lord of this manor hath disclayned and discharged James Winter her uncle for her Guardian and in his place and stead appointed her mother Ann Curmox now wife of Mr Henry Curmox to have the full Execution of her according to Law.
