date the fifth of the month of September 1731 made from
Thomas Mearns of a messuage and some lands in Lidington
and also all that hay yard lands thereunto belonging and
also all that close of pasture or ground called Prophy's close
and also that other hay yard lands to the same belonging
and also other copy lands in Lidington whatsoever to the
use and behoofe of Robert Smith
of Lidington in the County of Rutland Gent
of his hired and assigned forever according to the
Custom of the said Mannor Conduined for the Payment
of 10^s and Duties on the Eleventh Day of April
next and whereas the said sum of 10^s is paid in
Discharge of the said Surrender to me the said Robert Smith
according to the true intent & meaning of the proviso or
condition of the said Surrender

This is therefore to Authorize and empower you the
said John Blackwell to deliver up the said Surrender
to the said Thomas Mearns to be cancelled and made
void by all intents and purposes whatsoever and for
your soe doing this shall be your sufficient
Warrant Witness my hand this fifth day of May
