Whereas you have in your hands a Surrender bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1732 for Robert Skelton & all the his Messuages house with all & every the appurtenances belonging in Calcott afores<sup>d</sup> & then in the time & occupation of the s<sup>d</sup> Robert Skelton doth use & behold the s<sup>d</sup> Sarah Manning her kind & lawful for & according to the custom of the s<sup>d</sup> Manor with tenures therewith written to be void & payed & fifteen pounds eighteen shillings & six pence at & upon the fourth day of April which should then be in the Year of our Lord 1728: And whereas the s<sup>d</sup> Sum of fifteen pounds eighteen shillings & six pence with all interest for the same has been paid by the s<sup>d</sup> Robert Skelton to the s<sup>d</sup> Sarah Manning in full discharge & according to the true intent & meaning of the s<sup>d</sup> tenures & condition of the s<sup>d</sup> Surrender

This is therefore to authorize & empower you to release up the s<sup>d</sup> Surrender to the s<sup>d</sup> Robert Skelton & so you so doing that shall be you sufficient Warrant Given under my hand this twentieth five day of October Anno Domini 1731
