Be it remembered that by day & year above  
written Robert Boyer & Elizabeth his wife two of  
the customary tenants of the Mannor of <sup>Caldestott</sup> the  
afore<sup>said</sup> being solely & solely seized by Henry  
Hans Esq. Steward of the s<sup>d</sup> Mannor. Did out of  
s<sup>d</sup> surrender into the hands of the Lord of the said  
Mannor by the hands of the afores<sup>d</sup> Steward  
All that messuage or town<sup>e</sup> yard, barn, stable,  
outhouses & other edifices & ten of pasture  
thereunto belonging w<sup>th</sup> their cury of their appurtenances  
now in the possession of the said Robert Boyer  
So the wife & heiress of Magdalen Elgtham of  
Oppington in the County of Rutland widow  
& of her heirs & assigns for ever according to  
the custom of the s<sup>d</sup> Mannor. Upon this proviso  
& condition that if the said Robert  
Boyer or Elizabeth his wife their heirs or  
assigns or any of them do or shall will fully  
pay or cause to be paid unto the s<sup>d</sup> Magdalen  
Elgtham her & assigns the  
full contented sum of fifteen pounds of good  
& lawful money of England w<sup>th</sup> the lawful interest  
thereunto thereof of like money on the next  
twentieth day of September next ensuing the  
date hereof then this surrender to be void or  
severed

the date hereof according to the Condition of the same  
whereof the w<sup>th</sup> in written is attopy & on this obligation  
to be void or otherwise not
