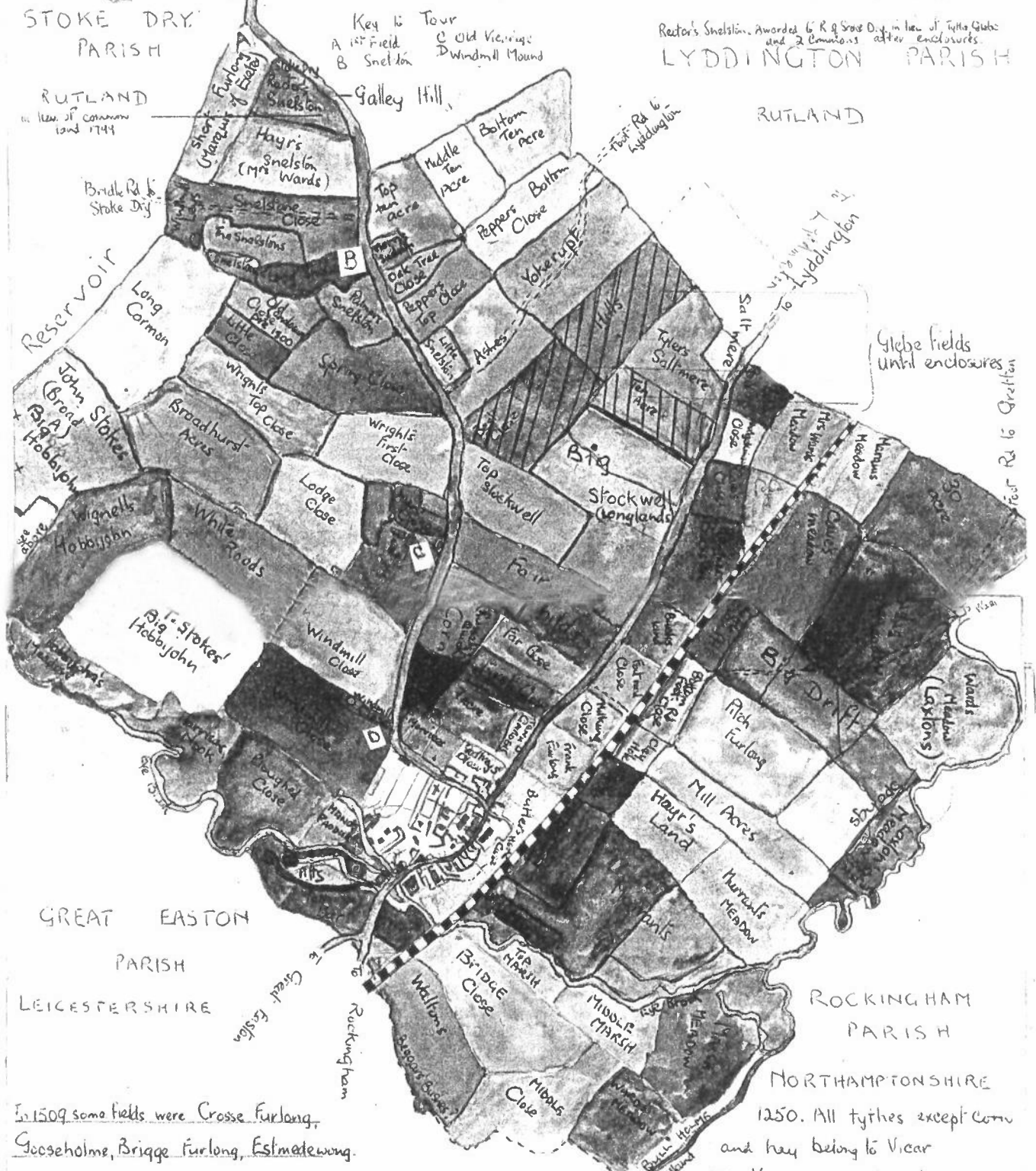
MAP OF CALECOTT PARISH IN RUTLAND, FIELD NAMES

1250. All tythes except Corn and hay belong to Vicar
1534 Vicar received 2 marks a year from Churches of Calecote & Snelsdon
1647. Vicar received £31p a from Lyddington Vicar. 1742 he received from cottagers Pigs, fruit, honey pigeons, wax, 2^d as waxe shot 2sh for milch beast, 10 for every score Sheep.
