**William CAVE, shepherd of Caldecott**

**Will proved 1829**

1 This is the last Will and Testament of me William Cave of  
2 Caldecott in the County of Rutland Shepherd First I give devise  
3 and bequeath unto my Wife Sarah Cave All and singular  
4 my Goods Chattels and Credits and All my real and personal  
5 Estate of whatever Nature Tenure Kind Sort or Quality the same  
6 may be To hold to my said Wife and her Assigns for and  
7 during the Term of her natural Life And from and  
8 after her Decease I dispose of the same as follows that is  
9 to say I give and devise All my Messuages Lands  
10 Tenements and Hereditaments whether Freehold or Copyhold  
11 the Copyhold being surrendered to the Use of this my Will or  
12 of whatever Nature Tenure Kind Sort or Quality the same  
13 may be with the Appurtenances belonging to the same  
14 To my Son William Cave his Heirs and Assigns for ever  
15 subject nevertheless and which I do hereby make charge-  
16 able with the Payment of Thirty Pounds a Piece to each  
17 of my three Sons John Thomas and George Cave and of  
18 Twenty Pounds a Piece to my Daughters [words scored out]  
19 Christian Cave - Which said Legacies are to be paid  
20 to the respective Legatees twelve Months after the Death  
21 of my said Wife And I do hereby appoint my said Wife  
22 Sarah Cave and my Son William Cave Executrix and Executor  
23 jointly of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof  
24 I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Twenty fifth Day of  
25 February one Thousand eight Hundred and Ten  
26 Signed Sealed Published and declared by the said  
27 William Cave the Testator as and for his last Will and  
28 Testament in the presence of us who at his Request and  
29 in his presence and in the presence of each other have  
30 subscribed our Names as Witnesses thereto

33 On the eighth day of June in the Year of our Lord  
34 one Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Nine  
35 William Cave one of the Executors within named  
36 was duly sworn and also made oath that the  
37 whole of the personal Estate and Effects of the  
38 Deceased at the time of his Death, did not  
39 amount in value to the sum of Fifty Pounds  
40 The Testator died on  
41 the 22nd day of March
