LAO Lidd Wills 10

1 In the name of God Amen the thirteenth day of July
2 in the yeare of our Lord god one thousand six hundred fivtie
3 & five: I Elizabeth Thorpe of Cauldicott in the Countie
4 of Rutland Widow beeinge in perfect health memorie understanding:
5 praised bee god: doe make & ordaine this my Laste will & testament
6 in manner & forme followinge thatt is to say first I Commend
7 my soule into the handes of Allmightie god Trusteing in & through
8 the onely merretts of Jesus Christ my Saviour to bee mayd *pertaining*
9 of everlasteing Life & Salvation & my bodye to the Earth to bee
10 decently buried, & for those worldly goodes itt hath pleased God to
11 Lend mee I give & bequeath in maner & forme following
12 First I Give unto my daughter Susanna Peach one Iron Bar &
13 hooke in the hall Chimneye \in money ten shillings/ & to Prudence Kerbie my daughter
14 tenn shillings & to John Kerbie: Zepenir Kerbie: Zakerie Kerbie
15 & Walter Kerbie my Grand Children ten shillings Apeece & to
16 the poore people of Cauldicott ten shillings, to be disposed of by
17 Advice of my executorixes, All the Reste of my Goodes & Chatteles
18 Whatsoever unbequeathed I my debtes & funeral expences being
19 discharged I Give unto my three Grand Children: Bridget Kerbie
20 Prudence Kerbie & Elizabeth Kerbie whom I make joint Exeectrixes
21 of this my Last Will & testament & doe make & ordain Lawrence
22 Peach my Sonn in Lawe overseer of this my Last Will & testament
23 & to see the same *performed* Acordinge to the trew intent & meaning
24 therre of & hee to have his Resonable Charges, & doe Advise & Command
25 my executrixes to bee Ruled & ordered by him in the shareing of my
26 goodes as they exspect Ableseing of whatt I Leave them, in witnes
27 where of I have heare unto sett my hand & seale the day & yeare
28 first above written, memorandum I doe give unto Lawrence Peach
29 tenn shillings to by him Apaire of Gloves, & to Walter Newbon
30 my Grand sonn ten shillings
